 - Authorizes a public offering or private placement to carry out the refunding program
 - Sets a minimum 3.00% net present value savings
 - No extension of final maturity date on any given series
 - File Final R.O.P. under new DOF form on or after Jan. 1, 2016

Subject: Authorize Purchase of 2015 Ferrara Rescue Pumper

Proposed Motion:

Approve purchase of a 2015 Ferrara Pumper fire truck and associated components, from Ferrara Fire Apparatus, Inc. in the amount of \$424,173.50.

Subject/Discussion:

This request is to replace the Fire Department's truck #3, which is an obsolete 1962 American LaFrance Fire Pumper. The new one-ton vehicle is a 2015 Ferrara Midship Pumper and will serve to combat brush and wild fires, with the additional ability to run on the railroad tracks, if needed. The City began ordering Ferrara vehicles several years ago, as they are good quality and comparably priced, and most of their equipment is universal, so the City is not required to utilize Ferrara for future repairs or equipment, making them cost effective vehicles. Four existing Lemoore fire trucks are from Fire Apparatus, Inc.

Once the vehicle is procured, additional equipment will be required.

The 1962 vehicle will be retired and disposed of according to City and/or State requirements.

Financial Consideration(s):

The fiscal year 2016 budget includes an asset replacement expenditure for \$450,000. The vehicle is already on order and will be ready for delivery in mid-January 2016.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Pros:

- Maintains public safety assets available to serve needs in the City and County, if needed.
- Retires obsolete equipment.

Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act



January 5, 2016

The Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act consists of three discrete pieces of legislation:

- AB 266 (Bonta, Cooley, Jones-Sawyer, Lackey, Wood) Establishes dual licensing structure requiring state license and a local license or permit. Department of Consumer Affairs heads overall regulatory structure establishing minimum health and safety and testing standards.
- **AB 243 (Wood)** Establishes a regulatory and licensing structure for cultivation sites under the Department of Food and Agriculture.
- **SB 643 (McGuire)** Establishes criteria for licensing of medical marijuana businesses, regulates physicians, and recognizes local authority to levy taxes and fees.

Two areas will require immediate attention from local governments:

- **Deliveries and mobile dispensaries:** Delivery is permitted with a State license unless a city adopts an express prohibition on delivery (AB 266).
- Cultivation ordinances: Cities must adopt an ordinance prohibiting or regulating cultivation prior to March 1, 2016.
 Otherwise the State will be sole licensing authority.

Delivery of Medical Marijuana (AB 266)

- "Delivery" means the commercial transfer of medical cannabis or medical cannabis products from a dispensary, up to an amount determined by the bureau to a primary caregiver or qualified patient as defined in Section 11362.7 of the Health & Safety Code, or a testing laboratory.
- *"Deliveries" can only be made by a dispensary and in a city, county, or city and county that does not* **explicitly prohibit** *it by local ordinance*. Business & Professions Code 19340(a). See also Section 19340(b)(1).
- Therefore, if your city wishes to prohibit delivery of medical marijuana within your city, an ordinance must be adopted to explicitly prohibit deliveries.

Cultivation (AB 243)

- AB 243 (Wood) prohibits cultivation of medical marijuana without first obtaining both a local license/permit/other entitlement for use and a state license. A person may not apply for a state license without first receiving a local license/permit/other entitlement for use.
- A person may not submit an application for a state license if proposed cultivation will violate provisions of local ordinance or regulation or if medical marijuana is prohibited by city, county, or city and county either expressly or otherwise under principles of permissive zoning (Health & Safety 11372.777(b)).
- **However**...If a city, county, or city and county does not have land use regulations or ordinances regulating or prohibiting the cultivation of marijuana, *either expressly or otherwise under the principles or permissive zoning*, or chooses not to administer a conditional permit program pursuant to this section, then commencing March 1, 2016, the state is the sole licensing authority for medical marijuana cultivation applicants (Health & Safety 11372.777(c)(4)).

Existing City Ordinance

4-8-3: PERSONAL USE CULTIVATION:

 An individual qualified patient or person with an identification card shall be allowed to cultivate marijuana within his/her private residence, in an attached garage, or in an accessory building if the property is a detached single-family residence. A primary caregiver shall only cultivate medical marijuana at the residence of a qualified patient or person with an identification card for whom he/she is the primary caregiver. Medical marijuana cultivation for personal use shall be subject to the following requirements:



Existing City Ordinance

4-8-4: COLLECTIVE OR COOPERATIVE CULTIVATION:

 For the collective or cooperative cultivation, such cultivation shall be confined to the ML (light industrial) zone district within the city and be subject to the restrictions of Health And Safety Code section 11362.768 and to the following requirements:





Recommended Ordinance

• <u>PERSONAL USE CULTIVATION:</u>

Personal use cultivation is a prohibited in all zone districts in the city.

MEDICAL MARIJUANA COLLECTIVE, COOPERATIVES, OR DISPENSARY:

A medical marijuana collective, cooperative, or dispensary is a prohibited use in all zone districts in the city.

MEDICAL MARIJUANA CULTIVATION :

Prohibition of marijuana cultivation. Marijuana cultivation by any person, including primary caregivers and qualified patients collectives, cooperatives or dispensaries, is prohibited in all zone districts within the city. Prohibited medical marijuana cultivation declared a public nuisance.

The establishment, maintenance, or operation of any prohibited cultivation of medical marijuana, as defined in this chapter, within the city is declared to be a public nuisance and is prohibited in all zone districts. Each person or responsible party is subject to abatement proceedings, in addition to all other legal and equitable relief available to the city.

MARIJUANA DELIVERY PROHIBITED:

No Person shall deliver marijuana to any location within the City from a mobile marijuana dispensary, regardless of where the mobile marijuana dispensary is located, or engaged in any operation for this purpose.

No person shall deliver any marijuana-infused product such as tinctures, baked goods or other consumable products, to any location within the City from a mobile marijuana dispensary, regardless of where the mobile marijuana dispensary is located, or engage in any operation for this purpose Public Nuisance declared

Operation of any mobile marijuana dispensary within the City in violation of the provisions of this Chapter is hereby declared a public nuisance and may be abated pursuant to all available remedies.

VIOLATION AND PENALTY

Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a maximum penalty of six(6) months imprisonment in the County Jail or a fine of one thousand dollars(\$1,000.00), as well as the administrative penalties as set forth, as may be amended. Violators shall be subject to any other enforcement remedies available to the city under any applicable state or federal statue or pursuant to any other lawful power the city may possess.

PUBLIC NUISANCE

SEVERABILITY

If any section, subsection, sentence or clause of this chapter is, for any reason, held to be invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this chapter.



Subject/Discussion:

The Lemoore Redevelopment Agency issued its \$19,150,000 Tax Allocation Bonds ("2011 Bonds") prior to the dissolution of the Redevelopment Agency. The proceeds from the 2011 Bonds have been held by the trustee due to the dissolution of the redevelopment agency and the previous position of the State Department of Finance that these bond proceeds could not be expended on any projects.

Refunding of the 2011 Tax Allocation Bonds

On September 22, 2015 the Governor signed Senate Bill No. 107 (SB 107), which allows the Lemoore Successor Agency to utilize from 5% up to 35% of the bond proceeds in a manner consistent with the original bond covenants. The Successor Agency must obtain an approval for a Last and Final Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) with the California Department of Finance (CDOF), in order to meet the requirements to spend 35% of the bond proceeds. CDOF is expected to have a template available by early January 2016 to complete this task.

Staff has consulted with Acacia Financial Group, Inc., a municipal financial advisory firm, regarding the potential savings associated with refunding of the bonds held by the Successor Agency to the Former Redevelopment Agency. This scenario assumes that the Successor Agency will be successful in obtaining the Last and Final ROPS approval from the State Department of Finance. In order to allow sufficient time for a proposed closing date in May 2016 (within 90 days of the first call date of August 1, 2016), staff is requesting approval from the Successor Agency with this agenda item. The recommendation is to refinance the 2011 Bonds having a current average coupon interest rate of 7.33%. In accordance with SB 107, the proposed transaction would redeem 65% of the existing bonds and refund the remaining 35% to be used for projects by the City initially specified in the bond covenant. The total interest rate on the new bonds is currently projected at 4.25%, which is over 3% lower than the 2011 Bonds. The current market rates may change between now and early to mid-April, when pricing on this transaction would occur.

of the financing is estimated at \$28,800,000 using market rates as of mid-December when this staff report was completed. This savings would be realized through 2040.

Positive Impact to the City of Lemoore.

1. Annual increase in tax revenues from the savings. The potential savings on the debt payments of the Lemoore Successor Agency would have the effect of increasing the funds available at the County to distribute to the local taxing entities. The City of Lemoore receives approximately 19.8% of general property taxes, which would provide a similar percentage of the annual savings to the City's general fund, which calculates out to approximately \$5,700,000 over the term on the refunded bond issue.

2. Cost of issuance benefit to Lemoore. The City would receive a one-time fiscal consultant fee of \$25,000 as part of costs of issuance for costs for the refunding (subject to State approval), similar to what was approved on the refunding of other Successor Agency bonds in 2014.

3. Availability of 2011 Bond Proceeds for City Projects. Under SB 107, the City would be authorized to spend up to 35% of the original bond proceeds on previouslyenumerated projects, as opposed to retaining the funds in escrow or calling the bonds. Potential projects the funds could be used for (as outlined in the initial issuance documents) include street improvements near Bush Street and State Route 41); Watewater Treatment Plant engineering, design and construction; Cedar Lane extension and right-of-way acquisition; police and fire dispatch center; highway and wayfinding signage; Americans with Disabilities Act compliant sidewalks; and widening of Hanford Armona Road from State Route 41 to 19th Avenue.

To move forward, the board of the Lemoore Successor Agency must approve a resolution authorizing the refunding of the 2011 Bonds. Thereafter, staff would request a meeting of the Oversight Board for Successor Agency to the Former Lemoore Redevelopment Agency to provide similar approval. While certain details for implementing SB 107 must still be determined by the CDOF, it is staff's understanding that there will be a 100-day review for any petitions to spend proceeds under SB 107, as well as the requisite 60-day review of any Successor Agency debt refinancing's (staff believes they will run concurrently). Accordingly, staff does not expect approval by the State until April or May 2016, which will allow completion of the refinancing shortly thereafter.

Financial Consideration(s):

If the Last and Final ROPS is approved by CDOF, bond proceeds of approximately \$4,650,000 will be available for the Successor Agency to spend on projects and approximately \$1,160,000 will be available to the Lemoore Housing Authority for Low & Moderate income projects for the City. The bond proceeds must be expended on projects that were included in the original bond covenants.

In addition to the bond proceeds, the proposed refunding of the 2011 Bonds would provide the estimated \$2,800,000 savings on debt payments over the next 25 years (or \$6,550,000 on a net present value basis, taking into account the bond redemption). The proposed refunding would defer principal payments until 2034, in part to obtain greater savings now, and in part to take advantage of the increased assessed valuations between now and 2034. Also, the 2016 Lemoore Tax Allocation Refunding Bonds would be scheduled to be paid in full as of August 1, 2040, the same final maturity date as the existing 2011 Bonds. This will result in an increase in the annual excess tax increment *"In God We Trust"*

available to be distributed to the taxing entities over the next 25 years, due in part to the reduces interest costs.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Alternatives include redeeming 100% of the 2011 Bonds at the earliest call date of August 2016; redeeming 95% and refunding 5% of the 2011 Bonds to be expended on projects, as allowed by SB 107 or redeeming 65% and refunding 35% of the bond proceeds for projects, as allowed by SB 107.

Pros:

- If successful in obtaining an approved Last and Final ROPS under SB 107, the Successor Agency would have access to approximately \$4,650,000 for City projects and \$1,160,000 for Lemoore Housing Authority Low & Moderate projects.
- The savings from the refunding will generate an annual increase in the excess tax increment that will be distributed to the taxing entities, including the City of Lemoore.
- Potential projects may indirectly cause an increase in future assessed valuations. The projects may improve city infrastructure that is needed to allow new development within the city.

RESOLUTION NO. 2016-01

A RESOLUTION OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE LEMOORE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING BONDS IN ORDER TO REFUND CERTAIN OUTSTANDING BONDS OF THE FORMER LEMOORE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN INDENTURE OF TRUST RELATING THERETO, APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN ESCROW AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE BONDS BEING REFUNDED, REQUESTING OVERSIGHT BOARD APPROVAL OF THE ISSUANCE OF THE REFUNDING BONDS, REQUESTING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS BY THE OVERSIGHT BOARD, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 34172(a) of the California Health and Safety Code (unless otherwise noted, Section references hereinafter being to such Code), the Lemoore Redevelopment Agency (the "Former Agency") has been dissolved and no longer exists as a public body, corporate and politic, and pursuant to Section 34173 of the Code, the City Council of the City of Lemoore (the "City") has become the successor entity to the Former Agency (the "Successor Agency"); and

WHEREAS, the Former Agency was a public body, corporate and politic, duly established and authorized to transact business and exercise powers under and pursuant to the provisions of the Community Redevelopment Law of the State of California, constituting Part 1 of Division 24 of the Health and Safety Code of the State (the "Law"); and

WHEREAS, a redevelopment plan for the redevelopment project area designated the "Lemoore Redevelopment Project" in the City of Lemoore, California (the "Redevelopment Project") was adopted in compliance with all requirements of the Law; and

WHEREAS, prior to dissolution of the Former Agency, the Former Agency issued its Lemoore Redevelopment Agency (Kings County, California), Lemoore Redevelopment Project, 2011 Tax Allocation Bonds in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$19,150,000 (the "Prior Bonds") in order to raise funds for programs, projects and activities relating to the Redevelopment Project; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill X1 26, effective June 29, 2011 ("AB 26"), together with AB 1484, effective June 27, 2012 ("AB 1484" and, collectively with AB 26, the "Existing Dissolution Act"), resulted in the dissolution of the Former Agency as of February 1, 2012, and the vesting in the Successor Agency of all of the authority, rights, powers, duties and obligations of the Former Agency; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 107 ("SB 107"), effective September 22, 2015, makes technical and substantive amendments to the Existing Dissolution Act (the Existing Dissolution Act as amended by SB 107 is referred to as the "Dissolution Act"); and

WHEREAS, SB 107 modifies Section 34191.4(c)(2), by, among other things, (i) allowing thirty five percent (35%) of the proceeds derived from the Prior Bonds, in excess of the amounts needed to satisfy approved enforceable obligations (the "Spendable Proceeds"), to be used in a manner consistent with the original bond covenants, so long as the Successor Agency has an approved Last and Final Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule pursuant to Section 34191.6, and (ii) directing that all remaining bond proceeds (other than the Spendable Proceeds) must be used at the earliest date permissible under the applicable bond covenants to defease the Prior Bonds or to purchase those same outstanding Prior Bonds on the open market for cancellation; and

WHEREAS, Section 34177.5 authorizes the Successor Agency to issue refunding bonds pursuant to Article 11 (commencing with Section 53580) of Chapter 3 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code (the "Refunding Law") for the purpose of achieving debt service savings within the parameters set forth in Section 34177.5(a)(1) (the "Savings Parameters"); and

WHEREAS, to determine compliance with the Savings Parameters for purposes of the issuance by the Successor Agency of its Successor Agency to the Lemoore Redevelopment Agency, 2015 Allocation Refunding Bonds (Lemoore Redevelopment Project) (the "Refunding Bonds"), the Successor Agency has caused its financial advisor, Acacia Financial Group, Inc. (the "Financial Advisor"), to prepare an analysis of the potential savings that will accrue to the Successor Agency and to applicable taxing entities as a result of the use of the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds to refund the Prior Bonds (the "Debt Service Savings Analysis"); and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency desires at this time to approve the issuance of the Refunding Bonds and to approve the form of and authorize the execution and delivery of the Indenture of Trust, by and between the Successor Agency and a trustee to be selected by the Successor Agency, as provided below, providing for the issuance of the Refunding Bonds (the "Indenture"), and the Escrow Agreement to be delivered to U.S. Bank National Association, as trustee for the Prior Bonds, to be dated as of the date of the issuance and delivery of the Refunding Bonds (the "Escrow Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency is now requesting that the Oversight Board direct the Successor Agency to undertake the refunding proceedings and to approve the issuance of the Refunding Bonds pursuant to this Resolution and the Indenture; and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency further requests that the Oversight Board make certain determinations described below on which the Successor Agency will rely in undertaking the refunding proceedings and the issuance of the Refunding Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency has determined to sell the Refunding Bonds to Hilltop Securities Inc. (the "Original Purchaser") pursuant to the terms of the Bond Purchase Agreement (the "Purchase Agreement") to be entered into by the Successor Agency and the Original Purchaser; and

WHEREAS, following approval by the Oversight Board of the issuance of the Refunding Bonds by the Successor Agency and upon submission of the Oversight Board Resolution to the California Department of Finance, the Successor Agency will, with the assistance of its Disclosure Counsel and the Financial Advisor to the Successor Agency, cause to be prepared a form of Official Statement for the Refunding Bonds describing the Refunding Bonds and containing material information relating to the Successor Agency and the Refunding Bonds, the preliminary form of which will be submitted to the Successor Agency for approval for distribution by the Original Purchaser, as underwriter of the Refunding Bonds, to persons and institutions interested in purchasing the Refunding Bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Successor Agency to the Lemoore Redevelopment Agency, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Determination of Savings; Compliance with Section 34177.5(a)(1). The Successor Agency has determined that there are significant potential savings available to the Successor Agency and to applicable taxing entities in compliance with the Savings Parameters by the issuance by the Successor Agency of the Refunding Bonds to provide funds to refund and defease part or all of the Prior Bonds, all as evidenced by the Debt Service Savings Analysis on file with the Successor Agency, which Debt Service Savings Analysis is hereby approved. In addition, the Refunding Bonds shall only be issued if the Refunding Bonds comply with the provisions of Section 34177.5(a)(1), including limiting the amount of the Refunding Bonds to the amount required to refund the Prior Bonds, and to pay the costs of issuing the Refunding Bonds, which may include amounts required to purchase bond insurance and a reserve fund surety bond for the Refunding Bonds.

Section 3. Approval of Issuance of the Refunding Bonds. The Successor Agency hereby authorizes and approves the issuance of the Refunding Bonds under the Law and the Refunding Law in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$8,300,000, provided that the Refunding Bonds are in compliance with the Savings Parameters and all other requirements of Section 34177.5 at the time of sale and delivery.

Section 4. Approval of Indenture. The Successor Agency hereby approves the Indenture prescribing the terms and provisions of the Refunding Bonds and the application of the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds. Each of the Mayor, the City Manager or the Finance Director, on behalf of the Successor Agency (each, an "Authorized Officer"), is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver, and the City Clerk of the City, on behalf of the Successor Agency, is hereby authorized and directed to attest to, the Indenture for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, in substantially the form on file with the Successor Agency, with such changes therein, deletions therefrom and additions thereto as the Authorized Officer executing the same shall approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery of the Indenture. The Authorized Officers are hereby directed and authorized to select a trustee for the Refunding Bonds. The Successor Agency hereby authorizes the delivery and performance of the Indenture.

Section 5. Approval of Escrow Agreement. The form of the Escrow Agreement on file with the Successor Agency is hereby approved and the Authorized Officers are, each acting alone,

hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, to execute and deliver the Escrow Agreement. The Successor Agency hereby authorizes the delivery and performance of its obligations under the Escrow Agreement.

Section 6. Oversight Board Approval of the Issuance of the Bonds. The Successor Agency hereby requests the Oversight Board, as authorized by Section 34177.5(f), to direct the Successor Agency to undertake the refunding proceedings and as authorized by Section 34177.5(f) and Section 34180 to approve the issuance of the Refunding Bonds pursuant to Section 34177.5(a)(1) and this Resolution and the Indenture.

Section 7. Appointment of Consultants. The Successor Agency hereby appoints The Weist Law Firm as Bond and Disclosure Counsel, Acacia Financial Group, Inc. as Financial Advisor, and Hilltop Securities Inc. as Underwriter. An Authorized Officer is authorized and directed to execute an agreement with each of such firms in the respective forms on file with the Secretary.

Section 8. Determinations by the Oversight Board. The Successor Agency requests that the Oversight Board make the following determinations upon which the Successor Agency will rely in undertaking the refunding proceedings and the issuance of the Refunding Bonds:

(a) The Successor Agency is authorized, as provided in Section 34177.5(f), to recover its costs related to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds from the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds, including the cost of reimbursing its administrative staff for time spent with respect to the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds;

(b) The application of proceeds of the Refunding Bonds by the Successor Agency to the refunding and defeasance of the Prior Bonds, as well as the payment by the Successor Agency of costs of issuance of the Refunding Bonds, as provided in Section 34177.5(a), shall be implemented by the Successor Agency promptly upon sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds, notwithstanding Section 34177.3 or any other provision of law to the contrary, without the approval of the Oversight Board, the California Department of Finance, the Kings County Auditor-Controller or any other person or entity other than the Successor Agency;

(c) The Successor Agency shall be entitled to receive its full Administrative Cost Allowance under Section 34181(a)(3) without any deductions with respect to continuing costs related to the Refunding Bonds, such as trustee's fees, auditing and fiscal consultant fees and continuing disclosure and rating agency costs (collectively, "Continuing Costs of Issuance"), and such Continuing Costs of Issuance shall be payable from property tax revenues pursuant to Section 34183. In addition and as provided by Section 34177.5(f), if the Successor Agency is unable to complete the issuance of the Refunding Bonds for any reason, the Successor Agency shall, nevertheless, be entitled to recover its costs incurred with respect to the refunding proceedings of the Refunding Bonds from such property tax revenues pursuant to Section 34183 without reduction in its Administrative Cost Allowance.

Section 9. <u>Filing of Debt Service Savings Analysis and Resolution</u>. The Successor Agency is hereby authorized and directed to file the Debt Service Savings Analysis, together with

a certified copy of this Resolution, with the Oversight Board, and, as provided in Section 34180(j) with the Kings County Administrative Officer, the Kings County Auditor-Controller and the California Department of Finance.

Section 10. Sale of Refunding Bonds. The Successor Agency hereby approves the Purchase Agreement. The Authorized Officers, each acting alone, are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Purchase Agreement for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, in substantially the form on file with the Successor Agency, with such changes therein, deletions therefrom and additions thereto as the Authorized Officer executing the same shall approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery of the Purchase Agreement.

Section 11. Issuance of Refunding Bonds in Whole or in Part. It is the intent of the Successor Agency to sell and deliver the Refunding Bonds in whole, provided that there is compliance with the Savings Parameters. However, the Successor Agency will initially authorize the sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds in whole or, if such Savings Parameters cannot be met with respect to the whole, then in part; provided that the Refunding Bonds so sold and delivered in part are in compliance with the Savings Parameters. The sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds that meet the Savings Parameters. In the event the Refunding of that portion of the Refunding Bonds that meet the Savings Parameters. In the event the Refunding Bonds are initially sold in part, the Successor Agency intends to sell and deliver additional parts of the Refunding Bonds without the prior approval of the Oversight Board provided that in each such instance the Refunding Bonds so sold and delivered in part are in compliance so sold and delivered in part are in compliance sold and delivered in part are sold in part.

Section 12. Subordination Agreements. The Successor Agency is hereby directed, at the discretion of an Authorized Officer, to request subordination of its pass-through obligations to taxing entities and the Authorized Officers are, each acting alone, hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, to execute and deliver subordination agreements as are necessary and applicable with such taxing entities. The Successor Agency hereby authorizes the delivery and performance of its obligations under such subordination agreements.

Section 13. Municipal Bond Insurance and Surety Bonds. The Authorized Officers, each acting alone, are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to obtain a municipal bond insurance policy for the Refunding Bonds and reserve account surety bonds for the Refunding Bonds from a municipal bond insurance company if it is determined, upon consultation with the Financial Advisor and the Original Purchaser, that such municipal bond insurance policy and/or surety bonds will be economic to reduce the true interest costs with respect to the Refunding Bonds.

Section 14. Approval of Official Statement. Following approval by the Oversight Board of the issuance of the Refunding Bonds by the Successor Agency and upon submission of the Oversight Board Resolution to the California Department of Finance, the Successor Agency will, with the assistance of its Disclosure Counsel, Fiscal Consultant and Financial Advisor, cause to be prepared a form of Official Statement for the Refunding Bonds describing the Refunding Bonds

and containing material information relating to the Successor Agency and the Refunding Bonds, the preliminary form of which will be submitted to the Successor Agency for approval for distribution by the Original Purchaser to persons and institutions interested in purchasing the Refunding Bonds.

Section 15. Official Actions. All actions heretofore taken by the officers and agents of the Successor Agency with respect to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified. Each Authorized Officers and any and all other officers of the Successor Agency are hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, to do any and all things and take any and all actions, including execution and delivery of any and all assignments, certificates, requisitions, including requisitions for the payment of costs of issuance of the Refunding Bonds, agreements, including agreements in customary form providing for the investment of the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds, notices, consents, and other documents, which they, or any of them, may deem necessary or advisable in (i) obtaining the requested approvals by the Oversight Board and the California Department of Finance, (ii) obtaining the subordination of any pass-through or tax sharing agreements, (iii) the issuance, sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds, and (iv) the refunding and defeasance of the Prior Bonds. Whenever in this Resolution any officer of the Successor Agency is directed to execute or countersign any document or take any action, such execution, countersigning or action may be taken on behalf of such officer by any person designated by such officer to act on his or her behalf in the case such officer is absent or unavailable.

Section 16. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect from and after the date of approval and adoption thereof.



Subject: Mandatory Commercial Organic Recycling Law

Proposed Motion:

Informational only.

Subject/Discussion:

In October of 2014 Governor Brown signed AB1826, a mandatory commercial organics recycling law. The bill requires the City to provide additional refuse service to businesses that generate eight cubic yards or more of organic waste per week to develop a plan by January 1, 2016 to recycle this material. Organic waste is defined as food waste and green waste. Grocery stores, restaurants and schools are typically the largest generators of organic food waste.

During a recent conference call, staff notified the state regulatory agency, Cal Recycle, that Lemoore currently does not have any businesses that generate eight cubic yards of organic waste per week. It was determined that Lemoore qualified for the January 1, 2019 commencement date, which requires compliance by cities with businesses generating four cubic yards or more of commercial waste.

Staff will implement an organic waste recycling program beginning in 2018 by identifying businesses that generate four cubic yards of commercial organic waste. Next steps include business outreach and education to ensure successful compliance with AB1826.

Financial Consideration(s):

"Green waste" containers or dumpsters will need to be added to commercial routes, estimated to cost less than \$10,000. State grants may be available to supplement the additional capital costs. At this time, staff is projecting that the requirement could be absorbed in current staff time.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Pros:

- Mandated by state law.
- State funds and grants may be applicable.

Cons:

• No immediate funds available through AB1826.

Proposed Motion:

Approve the purchase of a check valve and a clay valve for Well Number 11 and authorize a budget amendment in the amount of \$29,000.

Subject/Discussion:

Through the monitoring of City water wells, staff discovered that chlorine levels were being depleted at well number 11, located at the corner of N. Lemoore Avenue and Glendale Avenue at the same time the well was not running. After further investigation, it was determined that the butterfly valve, which prevents water from returning back into the well was not working properly. Although water was not back flowing into the well, chlorine was continuing to be dispensed into the well. Over a period of time, chlorine flowing directly into the well without water will destroy the well casing and will be exceedingly costly to replace.

It was also determined that a valve that assists with the blending of water from the North Well field needs to be replaced and upgraded so it may be controlled electronically instead of manually.

Financial Consideration(s):

Staff is requesting \$29,000 from Water Asset Replacement 4825AR which includes the purchase of the two valves and the cost of installation and programming. The estimated Water Asset Replacement balance is \$637,934. There may be savings in chlorine purchases.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Pros:

- Will likely prevent the higher cost of replacing the well casing.
- Will allow for the electronic control of chlorine and may reduce human error.May result in a cost avoidance and purchase of less chlorine moving forward.

Cons:

None noted.

It is recommended that Council approve the purchase of a check valve and a clay valve for well number 11 and authorize a budget amendment in the amount of \$29,000 (Department 4250 Account # 4825AR).

Family does not include institutional group living situations such as dormitories, fraternities, sororities, monasteries, convents, residential care facilities or military barracks, nor does it include such commercial group living arrangements as boardinghouses, lodging houses, and the like.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> "SUPPORTIVE HOUSING" definition of Subsection S of Section 5 of Article A of Chapter 4 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

S. "S" Definitions:

.

...SUPPORTIVE HOUSING: Housing that is linked with on or off site services that assist the resident in retaining the housing, improving his or her health status, and maximizing his or her ability to live and, where possible, work in the community. Per state law, these uses may not be regulated differently than other dwellings. In accordance

with Health And Safety Code section 50675.14, there is no limit on the length of stay and such facilities are occupied by a target population that includes, among other populations, adults, emancipated youth, families, families with children, elderly persons, young adults aging out of the foster care system, individuals exiting from institutional settings, veterans, and homeless people who are:

1. Low income having one or more disabilities, including mental illness, HIV or AIDS, substance abuse, or other chronic health conditions; or

2. Individuals eligible for services provided under the Lanterman development disabilities services act⁵.

SUPPORTIVE HOUSING: Housing with no limit on length of stay, that is occupied by the target population, and that is linked to an onsite or offsite service that assists the supportive housing resident in retaining the housing, improving his or her health status, and maximizing his or her ability to live and, when possible, work in the community.

SECTION 3. "TARGET POPULATION" definition added and "TRANSITIONAL HOUSING" definition amended in Subsection T of Section 5 of Article A of Chapter 4 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

T. "T" Definitions:

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING: Housing containing sleeping, kitchen, and bathroom facilities that are used to ease the transition of homeless individuals (including aged out foster children) to independent living within twenty four (24) months. Usually provided with supportive services to assist in finding and keeping permanent housing. Per state law, these uses may not be regulated differently than other dwellings.

TARGET POPULATION: Persons with low incomes who have one or more disabilities, including mental illness, HIV or AIDS, substance abuse, or other chronic health condition, or individuals eligible for services provided pursuant to the Lanterman Developmental Disabilities Services Act (Division 4.5 (commencing with Section 4500) of the Welfare and Institutions Code) and may include, among other populations, adults, emancipated minors, families with children, elderly persons, young adults aging out of the foster care system, individuals exiting from institutional settings, veterans, and homeless people.

TRANSITIONAL HOUSING: Buildings configured as rental housing developments, but operated under program requirements that require the termination of assistance and recirculating of the assisted unit to another eligible program recipient at a predetermined future point in time that shall be no less than six months from the beginning of the assistance."

- D. Prohibited Signs: The signs listed in this subsection are inconsistent with the purposes and requirements of this chapter as described below and as such are prohibited in all zoning districts, unless specifically authorized by another requirement of this article.

- 2. Billboards (off site signs with commercial message), as defined in this article. The city prohibits the construction, erection, or use of any billboards other than those that legally exist in the city, or for which a valid permit has been issued and has not expired, as of the date on which this provision is first adopted. No permit shall be issued for any billboard

which violates this policy, and the city will take immediate enforcement or abatement action against any billboard constructed or maintained in violation of this policy.

3. Can signs, as defined in this article.

- 4.3. Roof signs or signs placed above the roofline.
- 5. 4. Animated, flashing, scrolling, or video screen signs (e.g., electronic reader board sign) where the message changes more frequently than once every seven (7) seconds. Other types of signs such as barber poles or electronic reader board signs that change message less frequently than once every seven (7) seconds may be permitted consistent with the requirements of this article.
- 6. 5. Pennants, pinwheels, and other signs that utilize two (2) or more light bulbs in a wire string; paraphernalia composed of paper unless displayed inside a window; or signs displayed outdoors that are composed of paper or other lightweight material that could not be securely anchored, would easily degrade, or could not withstand limited exposure to the elements (e.g., a paper sign whose writing would become illegible if exposed to water, or a cardboard sign taped to a building exterior that could easily blow away).
- **7**. 6. Pole signs, as defined in this article. Note that freestanding signs constructed with poles as the substructure where the poles are encased to incorporate design features are not considered pole signs.
- 8. 7. Signs which are mobile, rotate, or move.
- **9**. 8. Signs placed on the public right of way or affixed to an element or structure on the public right of way, or located on a publicly owned tree, fence, or utility pole or otherwise posted on public property, except where required by a governmental agency; and signs on private property affixed to a fence; or signs affixed to a tree, shrub, rock, or other natural object on private property.
- 10. 9. Inflatable balloon signs, including, but not limited to, individual balloons, balloon strings, and other inflatable objects made of a flexible material and inflated so as to be lighter than air.
- 11. 10. Signs painted upon a fence.
- 12. 11. Signs affixed to vehicles or trailers that advertise or promote a business. This prohibition does not apply to signs permanently affixed to the side of a business or commercial vehicle or to signs required by state or federal law (e.g., contractor's license number) as exempted in the definition of a sign.
- 13. 12. Signs attached to light standards (poles) unless part of a sign program or street banner program.

14. 13. Signs affixed to a structure or property not owned by the person installing the signs.

SECTION 11. Subsection d of Subsection 6 of Subsection B of Section 4 of Article F of Chapter 5 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

B.....

6.....

d. Channel letters, reverse channel letters, and pushpin letters are preferred. As described in subsection <u>9-5F-2D</u>, "Prohibited Signs", of this article, can signs are prohibited.

SECTION 12. Subsection 9 to be added to Subsection B of Section 4 of Article F of Chapter 5 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

Subject/Discussion:

The City provides all City residents with a minimum of one blue recycling container. Due to a defect in the blue recycling containers, several residents requested new containers. A new vendor has since been procured; however, the current amount of replacement requests was not anticipated. New homes receive priority for new containers and currently there is a waiting list for replacement cans as well as residents requesting a second container.

The cost for the purchase of 400 recycling containers has been quoted at approximately \$22,000. Approximately \$6,929 from the California Recycling and Recovery grant will be applied to this purchase.

Financial Consideration(s):

Staff requests the expenditure of \$15,100 from the Refuse Operating Fund, with remaining \$6,900 from the Refuse grant proceeds, for a total of \$22,000.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Pros:

- New cans (Shaefer Systems) are more durable as they have been tested on multiple routes.
- Containers are easy to assemble with no tools required.
- There is a 50% less lead time on orders.

Cons:

• None noted.

Commission/Board Recommendation:

Not Applicable.

Staff Recommendation:

It is recommended that Council approve a budget amendment for the purchase of 400 recycling containers in the amount of \$22,000 (Department 4256 Account # 4220).

Subject/Discussion:

In preparation, for winter weather and El Niño, the Fox canal, which is located south of Highway 198 and west of 18th Avenue and west of West Hills College, and drains west towards the wetlands and annually needs to be cleared of weeds and/or debris. This canal allows the flow of City storm water out to the wetlands. The contracted work includes leveling existing material on the north side of the canal to allow canal access and the removal of any restricting material downstream from the canal in the wetland area.

Staff is currently working with West Hills College on an agreement to share the cost of the clean-up work.

Financial Consideration(s):

\$30,000 from the Sewer Fund with anticipated reimbursement for up to 50% of the costs from West Hills College. Three competitive bids were received for consideration from local contractors.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Pros:

• Preparation for the coming winter months and anticipated storms allowing for better storm drainage.

Cons:

• Possible overflow and flooding of Fox canal if not completed.

Proposed Motion:

Approve Resolution-2016-1 declaring three properties a nuisance and set a public hearing date 30 days thereafter.

Subject/Discussion:

Staff has left 48 hour notices, shut-off notices and abatement letters with the residents of properties located at: 773 Basil Court, 613 Follett Street, and 343 Juniper Street.

The properties have become public nuisances and a safety violation as defined in Section 8-2-1 of the Municipal Code; *B. Resolution Declaring Nuisance: Whenever any such building or buildings, structure or structures exist or are permitted upon any property within the City, the City Council may by resolution declare the same to be a public nuisance; said resolution shall declare the intention of the City Council to commence abatement proceedings as herein provided and shall refer to the street by the name under which it is officially or commonly known, and describe the property upon which such nuisance exists by giving the lot and block number thereof and no other description of such property shall be required. All listed properties are delinquent in paying City services which includes water, sewer and refuse and as a result the properties do not have water service.*

Further investigation shows that the properties in question are all currently inhabited with no water and refuse service being provided. Per California Health and Safety Code Section 17920.3 any dwelling with the "lack of hot and cold running water to plumbing fixtures in a dwelling unit" shall be considered to be a substandard building and not habitable.

Although the fore mentioned properties are considered not habitable, public notice requires 30 days to continue the abatement process. After public hearings are held, property owners are then allowed an additional 30 days to comply with abatement notice.

Financial Consideration(s):

Current staff time to date is approximately \$392.55. An additional \$1,200 is anticipated to finish the process. Each house could cost up to \$20,000 for demolition.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Pros:

Recuperates delinquent fees owed to the City if homeowners comply with Abatement orders.

Cons:

- Removal of residents should fees not be paid.
- Abatement cost come out of General Fund.

Commission/Board Recommendation:

Staff Recommendation:

Proposed Motion:

That the City Council, by motion, approve Ordinance No. 2016-01, An Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Lemoore, California, Imposing an Express Ban on Marijuana Cultivation, Marijuana Processing, Marijuana Delivery, and Marijuana Dispensaries in the City, and pass to second reading on January 19, 2016.

Subject/Discussion:

On October 9, 2015, Governor Jerry Brown signed the "Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act" ("Act") into law. The Act becomes effective January 1, 2016 and contains provisions that govern the cultivating, processing, transporting, testing, and distributing of medical marijuana to qualified patients throughout the state. The Act contains statutory provisions that allow local governments to enact ordinances prohibiting marijuana cultivation, processing, delivery, and dispensaries.

In 1996, the voters of the State of California approved Proposition 215 entitled "The Compassionate Use Act of 1996" or "CUA" to enable seriously ill Californians, under the care of a physician, to legally possess, use, and cultivate marijuana for medical use under state law. In 2003, the California Legislature adopted SB 420 entitled the Medical Marijuana Program ("MMP") which permits qualified patients and their primary caregivers to associate collectively or cooperatively to cultivate marijuana for medical purposes without being subject to criminal prosecution under the California Penal Code. Neither the CUA nor the MMP require or impose an affirmative duty or mandate upon a local government to allow, authorize, or sanction the establishment of facilities that cultivate or process medical marijuana within its jurisdiction. Under the Federal Controlled Substances Act, the use, possession, and cultivation of marijuana are unlawful and subject to federal prosecution without regard to a claimed medical need.

Several California cities have reported negative impacts to the public health, safety, and welfare resulting from marijuana cultivation, processing and distribution activities, including offensive odors, illegal sales and distribution of marijuana, trespassing, theft,

violent robberies and robbery attempts, fire hazards, and problems associated with mold, fungus, and pests.

AB 243 requires local agencies that regulate or desire to regulate the cultivation of marijuana to enact an ordinance expressly regulating this type of activity. Regulations governing the cultivation of marijuana are necessary to protect the health, safety and welfare of the City. During the past five years, more than 40 cities and 25 counties in California have adopted ordinances that regulate or ban the cultivation of medical marijuana within their jurisdictions.

The proposed ordinance expressly provides that cultivation of marijuana is prohibited in all zone districts in the City, and that no permit or license of any type shall be issued for marijuana cultivation within the City's jurisdictional limits.

AB 266 requires local agencies that ban or desire to ban marijuana delivery services or mobile marijuana dispensaries to enact an ordinance affirmatively prohibiting this type of activity. Marijuana delivery services, often referred to as mobile marijuana dispensaries, bring marijuana and marijuana products directly to residences, offices and certain unconventional locations. In many of these operations, businesses use runners to make the deliveries of marijuana. These so-called marijuana couriers advertise a wide variety of marijuana strains and other products, including edibles, in newspapers and on the Internet.

The proposed Ordinance expressly provides that marijuana delivery services are prohibited in the City, and that no permit or license of any type shall be issued for marijuana delivery services within the City's jurisdictional limits.

The Lemoore Municipal Code does not expressly address the cultivation, processing, delivery, and distribution of medical marijuana. To avoid having such federally prohibited activities permitted by the CUA, the proposed ordinance expressly prohibits the establishment and operation of marijuana cultivation, processing, delivery, and dispensary activities.

Currently, the City of Lemoore ordinance allows for personal use cultivation in residential areas subject to local building codes. Collective or cooperative cultivation is only allowed in Light Industrial zones. If the ordinance change is approved, personal cultivation would no longer be permitted.

Financial Consideration(s):

Adoption of this item is unlikely to add to local law enforcement or code enforcement costs, as the City today generally limits this activity in a similar manner to the proposed Ordinance.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Pros:

 By the City taking action with a land use ordinance and/or regulation or prohibition of the cultivation of marijuana, either expressly or otherwise under the principles of permissive zoning, or the City chooses not to administer a conditional permit program, then commencing March 1, 2016, the State Department of Food and Agriculture will be the sole licensing authority for medical marijuana cultivation applicants.

- If a city does not expressly prohibit the delivery of medical marijuana within its jurisdiction, delivery will be allowed (with a State dispensary license). This means that if Lemoore wishes to prohibit the delivery of medical marijuana within the City, the City must adopt an ordinance expressly prohibiting delivery services and mobile dispensaries.
- If the City does not adopt an express ban ordinance before the State begins issuing any State licenses, a State-licensed dispensary will be able to deliver medical marijuana within the City limits. Therefore, any ordinance must be in place before the State begins issuing State licenses. The State currently estimates that it will begin issuing dispensary licenses in January 2018, but that may happen sooner.

<u>Cons:</u>

• Failure to act will result in loss of local control.

Commission/Board Recommendation:

On November 9, 2015 staff presented highlights of the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act before the Planning Commission and expressed intent to present proposed zoning changes to the Zoning Ordinance as follows:

- Personal cultivation is prohibited in all zone districts in the City.
- All medical marijuana collective, cooperative, or dispensary is a prohibited use in all zone districts in the city.
- All medical marijuana delivery is prohibited in all zone districts in the City.

On December 14, 2015 staff proposed the above changes to the City's Zoning Ordinance and the Planning Commission approved the proposed changes with a recommendation to move forward to Council for final approval.

Staff Recommendation:

That the City Council, by motion, approve Ordinance No. 2016-01, an Ordinance of the City Council of the City of Lemoore, California, Imposing an Express Ban on Marijuana Cultivation, Marijuana Processing, Marijuana Delivery, and Marijuana Dispensaries in the City, and pass to second reading on January 19, 2016.

ORDINANCE NO. 2016-01

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE AMENDING IN ITS ENTIRETY CHAPTER 8 OF TITLE 4 AND AMENDING TABLE 9-4B-2 OF SECTION 2 OF ARTICLE B OF CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 9 AND SUBSECTIONS C, D, M, P, Q OF SECTION 5 OF ARTICLE A OF CHAPTER 4 OF TITLE 9 OF THE LEMOORE MUNICIPAL CODE RELATING TO MEDICAL MARIJUANA

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS.

- 1. <u>The Compassionate Use Act (Proposition 215)</u>. In 1996, with the adoption of Proposition 215, the California voters approved the Compassionate Use Act (Health and Safety Code § 11362.5) to ensure that seriously ill Californians have the right to obtain and use marijuana for medical purposes where that medical use is deemed appropriate and has been recommended by a physician, without fear of criminal prosecution under limited, specified circumstances.
- 2. <u>Supplemental Statutory Regulations (SB 420)</u>. In 2004, the State Legislature enacted SB 420 to clarify the scope of the Compassionate Use Act and provide additional statutory guidance regarding medical marijuana use. These statutes are codified at Health and Safety Code § 11362.7 et seq. and allow cities and counties to adopt supplemental rules and regulations.
- 3. <u>Federal Law (The Controlled Substances Act)</u>. While State law allows the use of marijuana for medical purposes, marijuana is an illegal controlled substance under the Federal Controlled Substances Act. The United States Supreme Court has ruled that notwithstanding California law, the distribution of medical marijuana through a medical marijuana dispensary is unlawful (<u>United States v. Oakland Cannabis Buyers' Cooperative</u> (2001) 532 U.S. 483) as is the possession, use, and cultivation of marijuana for personal medical purposes <u>Gonzales v. Raich</u> (2005) _____. U.S. ____. Violations are subject to federal prosecution.
- 4. <u>Health, Safety, and Welfare Concerns</u>. The City of Lemoore has identified a number of health, safety, and welfare concerns associated with the cultivation, distribution, delivery and consumption of medical marijuana. Some documented problems with cultivation include offensive odors, trespassing, theft, and violent encounters between growers and persons attempting to steal plants. For indoor grows, there are problems with fire hazards and problems associated with mold, fungus, and pests. For distribution, there are documented problems with medical marijuana dispensaries such as increased crime in and about the dispensary, robberies of customers, negative impact on nearby businesses, nuisance problems, and increased DUI's. Some of the concerns with the

consumption of marijuana include smoke drifting into neighboring residences, children being able to observe and smell the consumption of marijuana, and driving under the influence of marijuana.

There is a need to adopt health, safety, and welfare regulations, including appropriate zoning regulations, to avoid adverse impacts on the community which may arise from the cultivation, distribution, deliveries and consumption of medical marijuana.

5. <u>The Compassionate Use Act and SB 420 Could Lead to the Opening of</u> <u>Medical Marijuana Dispensaries</u>. Medical marijuana advocates assert that medical marijuana dispensaries, businesses which sell marijuana to qualified patients, persons with valid identification cards, and designated primary care givers are permitted by the Compassionate Use Act and SB 420. Individuals have relied upon these laws to open dispensaries in a number of communities throughout the State. Medical marijuana advocates assert that patients may designate these businesses as their primary caregiver and the business can serve an unlimited number of patients.

In addition to the primary caregiver provision, SB 420 allows qualified patients, persons with identification cards, and primary caregivers of qualified patients and persons with identification cards, to associate within California to collectively or cooperatively cultivate medical marijuana. Medical marijuana advocates have indicated that they may rely upon these provisions to operate medical marijuana dispensaries by having persons qualified to receive medical marijuana on their behalf.

Because of the problems associated with dispensaries and the potential for such dispensaries to open in the City, it is necessary to adopt regulations addressing medical marijuana dispensaries and deliveries to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Lemoore. Without a city ordinance in place, medical marijuana dispensaries could open in the City and operate without restriction, subject only to State and federal prosecutorial discretion for violations of State and federal drug laws.

6. <u>The Compassionate Use Act and SB 420 Could Lead to the Large-Scale</u> <u>Cultivation of Marijuana.</u> SB 420 provides that qualified patients, persons with valid identification cards, and designated primary care givers who associate within California in order to collectively or cooperatively cultivate marijuana for medical purposes are not subject to criminal sanctions. This provision could lead to the large-scale cultivation of medical marijuana within the City and the problems associated therewith. Therefore it is necessary to adopt regulations addressing the cultivation of medical marijuana to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Lemoore. Without a city ordinance in place, the cultivation of marijuana could occur within the City without restriction.

- 7. <u>AB 243 and AB266 Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act.</u> On October 9, 2015, Governor Jerry Brown signed AB 243 and AB266, the "Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act" ("Act"), into law. The Act becomes effective January 1, 2016 and contains provisions that govern the cultivating, processing, transporting, testing, and distributing of medical marijuana to qualified patients throughout the state. The Act contains statutory provisions that allow local governments to enact ordinances prohibiting marijuana cultivation, processing, delivery, and dispensaries.
- 8. <u>Intent to Comply With Federal Law</u>. In adopting this ordinance, the Council is intending to comply with federal law which prohibits the cultivation and distribution of marijuana, whether for medical purposes or otherwise. To the extent this ordinance does not address a particular aspect of the cultivation, distribution, delivery or consumption of medical marijuana, the City is not intending to permit conduct that is otherwise prohibited by federal law.
- 9. <u>Conduct Which Endangers Others: Nuisances</u>. Nothing in this ordinance shall be construed to allow persons to engage in conduct that endangers others or causes a public nuisance.

SECTION 2: AMENDMENT OF CODE: PUBLIC WELFARE (MEDICAL MARIJUANA).

Chapter 8, of Title 4, of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended in its entirety as follows:

MEDICAL MARIJUANA CULTIVATION

4-8-1: PURPOSE AND INTENT: 4-8-2: EFFECTIVE DATE: 4-8-3: PERSONAL USE CULTIVATION: 4-8-4: COLLECTIVE OR COOPERATIVE CULTIVATION: 4-8-3: DEFINITIONS: 4-8-4: PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES: 4-8-5: PERSONAL USE CULTIVATION: 4-8-6: MEDICAL MARIJUANA COLLECTIVE, COOPERATIVES, OR DISPENSARY: 4-8-7: MEDICAL MARIJUANA CULTIVATION: 4-8-7: MEDICAL MARIJUANA CULTIVATION: 4-8-9: VIOLATION AND PENALTY: 4-8-10: PUBLIC NUISANCE:

4-8-1: PURPOSE AND INTENT:

To the extent that the city is required to allow the cultivation of medical marijuana under state law, the rules set forth herein shall apply. Nothing in this chapter shall be interpreted to permit medical marijuana dispensaries, as defined by section <u>9-4A-5</u> of this code. (Ord. 2012-05, 11-20-2012)

It is the purpose and intent of this chapter to prohibit the cultivation of medical marijuana, medical marijuana dispensaries, cooperatives, collectives, deliveries and cultivation in order to preserve the public peace, health, safety, and general welfare of the citizens of the city. Additionally, it is the purpose and intent of this chapter to repeal outdated ordinances pertaining to medical marijuana in the city.

4-8-2: EFFECTIVE DATE:

- A. Thirty Days After Passage: The ordinance codified herein shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after thirty (30) days after its final passage and adoption. Within fifteen (15) days after its adoption, the ordinance codified herein, or a summary of the ordinance codified herein, shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation.
- B. Grace Period: Notwithstanding the foregoing, those qualified patients and persons with identification cards, and primary caregivers, who were cultivating marijuana in the city as of the date the ordinance codified herein was introduced by the city council in strict compliance with the medical marijuana cultivation regulations then in effect, and remain in strict compliance with those regulations, shall have a period of six (6) months from the effective date to comply with the amended regulations set forth in this chapter. For purposes of this grace period, "cultivating marijuana" shall mean actual growing plants. No new plantings or seedlings are allowed. (Ord. 2012-05, 11-20-2012)
- A. Thirty Days After Passage: The ordinance codified herein shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after thirty (30) days after its final passage and adoption. Within fifteen (15) days after its adoption, the ordinance codified herein, or a summary of the ordinance codified herein, shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation.

4-8-3: PERSONAL USE CULTIVATION: 🔁 🖃

An individual qualified patient or person with an identification card shall be allowed to cultivate marijuana within his/her private residence, in an attached garage, or in an accessory building if the property is a detached single-family residence. A primary caregiver shall only cultivate medical marijuana at the residence of a qualified patient or person with an identification card for whom he/she is the primary caregiver. Medical marijuana cultivation for personal use shall be subject to the following requirements:

- A. Area: The medical marijuana cultivation area shall not exceed thirty two (32) square feet measured by the canopy and not exceed ten feet (10') in height per residence. This limit applies regardless of the number of qualified patients or persons with an identification card residing in the residence. The cultivation area shall be a single designated area.
- B. Lighting: Medical marijuana cultivation lighting shall not exceed a total of one thousand two hundred (1,200) watts, unless a housing inspection and letter of compliance is first obtained (subsection <u>8-1A-2</u>B of this code) from the Lemoore building inspection division. Such housing inspection will determine if the existing electrical system can safely supply power to the proposed lighting at the proposed location. Should alterations be needed to the electrical system, a permit will need to be obtained by the applicant prior to any work being done.
- C. Building Code Requirements: Any alterations or additions to the residence, including garages and accessory buildings, shall be subject to applicable building and fire codes, including plumbing and electrical, and all applicable zoning codes, including lot coverage, setback, height requirements, and parking requirements.
- D. Gas Products: The use of gas products (CO₂, butane, etc.) for medical marijuana cultivation or processing is prohibited.
- E. Evidence Of Cultivation: From a public right of way, there shall be no evidence visible from the exterior of medical marijuana cultivation occurring on the site.
- F. Residence: The qualified patient or person with an identification card shall reside in the residence where the medical marijuana cultivation occurs.
- G. Cultivation Elsewhere In The City: The qualified patient or person with an identification card shall not participate in medical marijuana cultivation in any other location within the city of Lemoore.
- H. Incidental Use: The residence shall maintain a kitchen, bathrooms, and primary bedrooms for their intended use and not be used primarily for medical marijuana cultivation.
- I. Ventilation: The medical marijuana cultivation area shall include a ventilation and filtration system designed to ensure that odors from the cultivation are not detectable beyond the residence, or the property line for detached single-family residences, and designed to prevent mold and moisture and otherwise protect the health and safety of persons residing in the residence and cultivating the marijuana. This shall include, at a minimum, a system meeting the requirements of the current, adopted edition of the California building code section 1203.4 natural ventilation or section 402.3 mechanical ventilation (or its equivalent(s)). Subsection <u>9-5B-2</u>C1 of this code shall apply when determining the detection of odors (the "reasonable person" standard).

- J. Storage Of Chemicals: Any chemicals used for medical marijuana cultivation shall be stored outside of the habitable areas of the residence and outside of public view from neighboring properties and public rights of way.
- K. Nuisance: The medical marijuana cultivation area shall not adversely affect the health or safety of the nearby residents by creating dust, glare, heat, noise, noxious gases, odor, smoke, traffic, vibration, or other impacts; and shall not be hazardous due to the use or storage of materials, processes, products or wastes, or from other actions related to the cultivation.
- L. Property Owner Authorization: For rental property, the lessee shall obtain written authorization from the property owner or property management company to cultivate medical marijuana.
- M. Notification: The owner and any lessee of the residence upon which cultivation will occur shall inform the police department of the intent to cultivate medical marijuana and pick up a handout setting forth the owner and lessee responsibilities under this section. This notification shall be provided prior to the commencement of the cultivation, except that for existing cultivation, the information shall be provided within ten (10) days of the effective date of this chapter. The police department may direct the owner and lessee to the planning or building department for more information about building code and permit requirements that may be applicable if alterations or additions to the residence are contemplated. The police department and other involved departments shall keep patient information confidential to the extent required by law.
- N. Additional Requirements For Garages And Accessory Buildings: The following additional requirements shall apply for personal use cultivation that occurs in a garage or accessory building. The garage or accessory building shall be secure, locked, and fully enclosed, with a ceiling, roof or top. All walls and doors shall be entirely opaque. The ceiling, top or roof may contain transparent materials, provided, however, that its contents are not visible from adjoining uses, including multi story buildings, if applicable, or public rights of way. The garage or building shall include an audible alarm or a burglar alarm monitored by an alarm company or private security company. The garage or building, including all walls, doors, and the roof, shall be constructed with a firewall assembly of green board meeting the minimum building code requirements for residential structures and include material strong enough to prevent entry except through an open door. If the garage is to be structurally altered, the underlying zone district requirements for covered parking still apply, and must retain at least one covered space per residential dwelling unit.
- O. Posting Of Physician Recommendation Or Identification Card; Posting Of Owner Permission: A copy of a qualified patient physician recommendation or identification card shall be posted in a conspicuous place in the cultivation area for each patient residing in the residence who is cultivating medical marijuana. For rental properties, a

copy of the owner's written authorization to cultivate marijuana shall be posted in the same manner. (Ord. 2012-05, 11-20-2012)

4-8-4: COLLECTIVE OR COOPERATIVE CULTIVATION:

For the collective or cooperative cultivation, such cultivation shall be confined to the ML (light industrial) zone district within the city and be subject to the restrictions of Health And Safety Code section 11362.768 and to the following requirements:

- A. Secure Enclosed Structure; Code Compliance: The cultivation of medical marijuana shall at all times occur in a secure, locked, and fully enclosed structure, with a ceiling, roof or top. All walls and doors shall be entirely opaque. The ceiling, top or roof may contain transparent materials, provided, however, that its contents are not visible from adjoining uses, including multi-story buildings, if applicable, or public rights of way. The security shall include an audible alarm or a burglar alarm monitored by an alarm company or private security company. The structure shall meet all applicable building and fire codes, including plumbing and electrical, and all applicable zoning codes, including lot coverage, setback, height requirements, and parking requirements. At a minimum, the structure, including all walls, doors, and the roof, shall be constructed with a firewall assembly of green board meeting the minimum building code requirements for commercial structures and include material strong enough to prevent entry except through an open door.
- B. Ventilation: The structure for cultivating medical marijuana shall include a ventilation and filtration system designed to ensure that odors from the cultivation are not detectable beyond the property line and designed to prevent mold and moisture and otherwise protect the health and safety of those persons participating in the cultivation. This shall include, at a minimum, a system meeting the requirements of the current, adopted edition of the California building code section 1203.4 natural ventilation or section 402.3 mechanical ventilation (or its equivalent(s)). Subsection <u>9-5B-2</u>C1 of this code shall apply when determining the detection of odors (the "reasonable person" standard).
- C. Maximum Of Ninety Nine Plants: The maximum number of plants, whether mature or immature, shall not exceed ninety nine (99) marijuana plants.
- D. Signage And Markings: There shall be no signage or markings on the property, structure, on any other building located on the property, or off site, which in any way evidences that the collective or cooperative cultivation of medical marijuana is occurring on the property.
- E. Required Participation In The Cultivation; No Employees: All persons who associate together for the collective or cooperative cultivation must participate in the cultivation and the cultivation must occur solely among members of the association. No employees, independent contractors, or other persons may be utilized for the cultivation.

- F. No Compensation Or Sales; Distribution Only Among Members: No member may compensate any other member to cultivate on his/her behalf. All distribution of the cultivated marijuana shall be solely among members of the association and shall be without compensation of any kind. Nothing in this subsection shall be deemed to prevent a primary caregiver from subsequently providing the cultivated marijuana to one of his/her qualified patients.
- G. No On Site Consumption: No on site consumption of medical marijuana shall occur.
- H. No Cultivation In Conjunction With A Business; No Sales Of Goods Or Services: The cultivation shall not occur in conjunction with any business. No products or services shall be sold from the property where the cultivation occurs.
- I. Record Requirements: The owner and/or lessee of the property upon which the cooperative or collective grow occurs shall provide the following information to the police department in a form and manner approved by the police department:
 - 1. Full name, address, and telephone number(s) of the owner and lessee, including all alias names used in the previous ten (10) years;
 - 2. The address where correspondence is to be mailed;
 - 3. A list of all qualified patients, persons with identification cards, and primary caregivers participating in the cultivation (the list shall include each person's full name, alias names used, driver's license numbers, home and work addresses, and phone number(s));
 - 4. A copy of all participant physician recommendations, identification cards, and primary caregiver evidence;
 - 5. A sketch or diagram showing the property with the location of the cultivation and all buildings on the property, including a statement showing the total area occupied by the cultivation and the distance from the property lines;
 - 6. A statement setting forth the number of plants to be cultivated and demonstrating that the cultivation does not exceed the maximums set forth under state law or this chapter, namely patient maximums and the cap of ninety nine (99) plants;
 - 7. A statement identifying all persons who will be tending to the cultivation and describing the cultivation process;
 - 8. For lessees, written evidence that the owner has consented to use of the property for medical marijuana cultivation;
 - 9. Such other information as the police department determines is necessary to ensure compliance with state law and this chapter.

This information shall be provided prior to the commencement of the collective or cooperative cultivation except that for existing collective or cooperative cultivation operations, the information shall be provided within ten (10) days of the effective date of this chapter. The information provided shall be updated upon any change within ten (10) days. The police department shall keep patient information confidential to the extent required by law.

- J. Inspections: The cultivation operation shall be open for inspection by any law enforcement officer or city code enforcement officer (including, but not limited to, a city building inspector and fire marshal) between the hours of eight o'clock (8:00) A.M. and nine o'clock (9:00) P.M. seven (7) days a week, or at any time upon responding to a call for service related to the property where the cultivation is occurring.
- K. Violations: In addition to the remedies provided in this chapter, if the collective or cooperative cultivation occurs in violation of this chapter or any other local or state law or regulation, the owner or lessee shall be prohibited from further collective or cooperative cultivation at any location within the city for a period of one year after notice by the city of the violation. Subsequent violations shall result in a three (3) year prohibition. (Ord. 2012-05, 11-20-2012)

4-8-3:DEFINITIONS:

For the purposes of this chapter, these words and phrases shall be defined as follows:

"City" means the city of Lemoore.

"Cultivate" or "cultivation" is the planting, growing, harvesting, drying, processing, or storage of one or more marijuana plants or any part thereof in any location.

"Delivery" shall be as defined in the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act, California Business and Professions Code section 19300.5(m), as that section may be amended from time to time, and includes the commercial transfer of medical marijuana and medical marijuana products from a dispensary as well as the use of any technology platform that enables qualified patients and caregivers to arrange for or facilitate the transfer.

"Marijuana" shall have the same definition as in California Health and Safety Code Section 11018, as it now reads or as may be amended.

"Medical marijuana" means marijuana used for medical purposes in accordance with California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7 et seq., as may be amended.

"Medical marijuana collective" or "dispensary" means any operation, including a store-front facility or structure, mobile facility, or delivery service, wherein medical marijuana is made available, sold, offered for sale, given, distributed, traded, cultivated for, or otherwise provided to primary caregivers or qualified patients, as defined by this chapter.

A "medical marijuana collective" or "dispensary" shall not include the following uses, as long as the location of such uses is otherwise regulated by code or applicable law: (1) a clinic licensed pursuant to Chapter 1 of Division 2 of the California Health and

Safety Code; (2) a health care facility licensed pursuant to Chapter 2 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code; (3) a residential care facility for persons with chronic life-threatening illnesses licensed pursuant to Chapter 3.01 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code; (4) a residential care facility for the elderly licensed pursuant to Chapter 3.2 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code; and (5) a residential hospice or a home health agency licensed pursuant to Chapter 8 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code, as long as any such use complies strictly with applicable law including, but not limited to, California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7 et seq.

"Primary caregiver" shall have the same definition as in California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7 et seq., as it now reads or as amended.

"Qualified patient" shall have the same definition as California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7 et seq., as it now reads or as amended.

4-8-4: PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES:

Marijuana cultivation, marijuana processing, marijuana delivery, and marijuana dispensaries shall be prohibited activities in the City, except where the City is preempted by federal or state law from enacting a prohibition on any such activity. No use permit, variance, building permit, or any other entitlement, license, or permit, whether administrative or discretionary, shall be approved or issued for the activities of marijuana cultivation, marijuana processing, marijuana delivery, or the establishment or operation of a marijuana dispensary in the City, and no person shall otherwise establish or conduct such activities in the City, except where the City is preempted by federal or state law from enacting a prohibition on any such activity for which the use permit, variance, building permit, or any other entitlement, license, or permit, variance, building permit, or any other entitlement, license, or permit is sought.

4-8-5: PERSONAL USE CULTIVATION:

Personal use cultivation is a prohibited in all zone districts in the city.

4-8-6: MEDICAL MARIJUANA COLLECTIVE, COOPERATIVES, OR DISPENSARY:

A medical marijuana collective, cooperative, or dispensary is a prohibited use in all zone districts in the city.

4-8-7: MEDICAL MARIJUANA CULTIVATION:

Prohibition of marijuana cultivation. Marijuana cultivation by any person, including primary caregivers and qualified patients collectives, cooperatives or dispensaries, is prohibited in all zone districts within the city. Prohibited medical marijuana cultivation declared a public nuisance. The establishment, maintenance, or operation of any prohibited cultivation of medical marijuana, as defined in this chapter, within the city is declared to be a public nuisance and is prohibited in all zone districts. Each person or responsible party is subject to abatement proceedings, in addition to all other legal and equitable relief available to the city.

4-8-8: MARIJUANA DELIVERY PROHIBITED:

- A. <u>No Person shall deliver marijuana to any location within the City from a mobile</u> <u>marijuana dispensary, regardless of where the mobile marijuana dispensary is</u> <u>located, or regardless of whether a technology platform is used by the dispensary</u> <u>or engaged in any operation for this purpose.</u>
- B. <u>No person shall deliver any marijuana-infused product such as tinctures, baked</u> <u>goods or other consumable products, to any location within the City from a</u> <u>mobile marijuana dispensary, regardless of where the mobile marijuana</u> <u>dispensary is located, or engage in any operation for this purpose</u>

Public Nuisance declared

Operation of any mobile marijuana dispensary within the City in violation of the provisions of this Chapter is hereby declared a public nuisance and may be abated pursuant to all available remedies.

4-8-9: VIOLATION AND PENALTY:

Any person violating any of the provisions of this chapter shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and subject to a maximum penalty of six(6) months imprisonment in the County Jail or a fine of one thousand dollars(\$1,000.00), as well as the administrative penalties as set forth, as may be amended. Violators shall be subject to any other enforcement remedies available to the city under any applicable state or federal statue or pursuant to any other lawful power the city may possess.

4-8-10: PUBLIC NUISANCE

Any violation of this chapter is hereby declared to be a public nuisance.

SECTION 3: AMENDMENT OF CODE: PLANNING AND ZONING.

Subsection C of section 5 of Article A of Chapter 4 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

"City" means the City of Lemoore.

"Cultivate" or "cultivation" is the planting, growing, harvesting, drying, processing, or storage of one or more marijuana plants or any part thereof in any location.

Subsection D of section 5 of Article A of Chapter 4 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

"Delivery" shall be as defined in the Medical Marijuana Regulation and Safety Act, California Business and Professions Code section 19300.5(m), as that section may be amended from time to time, and includes the commercial transfer of medical marijuana and medical marijuana products from a dispensary as well as the use of any technology platform that enables qualified patients and caregivers to arrange for or facilitate the transfer.

Subsection M of section 5 of Article A of Chapter 4 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

MEDICAL MARIJUANA CULTIVATION COLLECTIVE OR COOPERATIVE: The indoor growing and cultivating of marijuana by a group of medical marijuana cardholders or their caregivers, without any compensation being given to anyone, within an enclosed building in the light industrial zone district. All persons who associate together for the collective or cooperative cultivation must participate in the cultivation and the cultivation must occur solely among members of the association. No employees, independent contractors, or other persons may be utilized for the cultivation. No member may compensate any other member to cultivate on his/her behalf. This type of cultivation shall be subject to requirements of title 4, chapter 8 of the municipal code.

MEDICAL MARIJUANA CULTIVATION PERSONAL USE: The indoor growing and cultivating of marijuana within a private residence, in an attached garage, or in an accessory building if the property is a detached single-family residence by an individual qualified patient or person with a medical marijuana identification card. A primary caregiver shall only cultivate medical marijuana at the residence of a qualified patient or person with an identification card for whom he/she is the primary caregiver. Medical marijuana cultivation for personal use shall be subject to requirements of <u>title 4, chapter</u> <u>8</u> of the municipal

MEDICAL MARIJUANA DISPENSARY: Any facility or location, whether fixed or mobile, where medical marijuana is made available to, distributed by, or distributed to more than three (3) of the following: 1) a qualified patient, 2) a person with a medical marijuana identification card, or 3) a primary caregiver. All three (3) of these terms are defined in strict accordance with California Health And Safety Code sections 11362.5 and 11362.7 et seq. Unless otherwise regulated by this code or applicable law, a "medical marijuana dispensary" shall not include the following uses: a clinic licensed pursuant to chapter 1 of division 2 of the Health And Safety Code, a healthcare facility licensed pursuant to chapter 2 of division 2 of the Health And Safety Code, a residential care facility for persons with chronic life threatening illness licensed pursuant to chapter 3.01 of division 2 of the Health And Safety Code, a residential care facility for the elderly licensed pursuant to chapter 3.2 of division 2 of the Health And Safety Code, a residential hospice, or a home health agency licensed pursuant to chapter 8 of division 2 of the Health And Safety Code, as long as any such use complies strictly with applicable law including, but not limited to, Health And Safety Code sections 11362.5 and 11362.7 et seq. Medical marijuana dispensaries where medical marijuana is distributed by, distributed to, or made available to any combination of three (3) or more qualified patients, persons with an identification card, or primary caregivers as defined by California Health And Safety Code section 11362.5 et seq., are prohibited in all zone districts.

"Marijuana" shall have the same definition as in California Health and Safety Code Section 11018, as it now reads or as may be amended.

"Medical marijuana" means marijuana used for medical purposes in accordance with California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7 et seq., as may be amended.

"Medical marijuana collective" or "dispensary" means any operation, including a store-front facility or structure, mobile facility, or delivery service, wherein medical marijuana is made available, sold, offered for sale, given, distributed, traded, cultivated for, or otherwise provided to primary caregivers or qualified patients, as defined by this chapter.

A "medical marijuana collective" or "dispensary" shall not include the following uses, as long as the location of such uses is otherwise regulated by code or applicable law: (1) a clinic licensed pursuant to Chapter 1 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code; (2) a health care facility licensed pursuant to Chapter 2 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code; (3) a residential care facility for persons with chronic life-threatening illnesses licensed pursuant to Chapter 3.01 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code; (4) a residential care facility for the elderly licensed pursuant to Chapter 3.2 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code; and (5) a residential hospice or a home health agency licensed pursuant to Chapter 8 of Division 2 of the California Health and Safety Code, as long as any such use complies strictly with applicable law including, but not limited to, California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7 et seq.

Subsection P of section 5 of Article A of Chapter 4 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

"Primary caregiver" shall have the same definition as in California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7 et seq., as it now reads or as amended.

Subsection Q of section 5 of Article A of Chapter 4 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

"Qualified patient" shall have the same definition as California Health and Safety Code Section 11362.7 et seq., as it now reads or as amended.

SECTION 4. CALIFORNIA ENVIRONMENTAL QUALITY ACT FINDING.

This Ordinance is categorically exempt from environmental review pursuant to CEQA Guidelines Section 15061(b)(3).

SECTION 5. SEVERABILITY.

If any provision of this ordinance is declared unlawful by a court of competent jurisdiction, the Council intends that the remaining provisions of this ordinance remain in effect.

SECTION 6. EFFECTIVE DATE.

This ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after thirty (30) days after its final passage and adoption. Within fifteen (15) days after its adoption, the ordinance, or a summary of the ordinance, shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation.

Subject: Refunding of the 2011 Tax Allocation Bonds – Resolution 2016-01

Proposed Motion:

Adopt Resolution 2016-01, approving the form and documents relating to the Issuance and Sale of 2016 Tax Allocation Refunding Bonds to Refinance Outstanding 2011 Bonds of the Former Lemoore Redevelopment Agency.

Subject/Discussion:

The Lemoore Redevelopment Agency issued its \$19,150,000 Tax Allocation Bonds ("2011 Bonds") prior to the dissolution of the Redevelopment Agency. The proceeds from the 2011 Bonds have been held by the trustee due to the dissolution of the redevelopment agency and the previous position of the State Department of Finance that these bond proceeds could not be expended on any projects.

On September 22, 2015 the Governor signed Senate Bill No. 107 (SB 107), which allows the Lemoore Successor Agency to utilize from 5% up to 35% of the bond proceeds in a manner consistent with the original bond covenants. The Successor Agency must obtain an approval for a Last and Final Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule (ROPS) with the California Department of Finance (CDOF), in order to meet the requirements to spend 35% of the bond proceeds. CDOF is expected to have a template available by early January 2016 to complete this task.

Staff has consulted with Acacia Financial Group, Inc., a municipal financial advisory firm, regarding the potential savings associated with refunding of the bonds held by the Successor Agency to the Former Redevelopment Agency. This scenario assumes that the Successor Agency will be successful in obtaining the Last and Final ROPS approval from the State Department of Finance. In order to allow sufficient time for a proposed closing date in May 2016 (within 90 days of the first call date of August 1, 2016), staff is requesting approval from the Successor Agency with this agenda item. The recommendation is to refinance the 2011 Bonds having a current average coupon interest rate of 7.33%. In accordance with SB 107, the proposed transaction would redeem 65% of the existing bonds and refund the remaining 35% to be used for projects by the City initially specified in the bond covenant. The total interest rate on the new bonds is currently projected at 4.25%, which is over 3% lower than the 2011 Bonds. The current market rates may change between now and early to mid-April, when pricing on this

transaction would occur. The potential savings for the refunding over the remaining term of the financing is estimated at \$28,800,000 using market rates as of mid-December when this staff report was completed. This savings would be realized through 2040.

Positive Impact to the City of Lemoore.

1. Annual increase in tax revenues from the savings. The potential savings on the debt payments of the Lemoore Successor Agency would have the effect of increasing the funds available at the County to distribute to the local taxing entities. The City of Lemoore receives approximately 19.8% of general property taxes, which would provide a similar percentage of the annual savings to the City's general fund, which calculates out to approximately \$5,700,000 over the term on the refunded bond issue.

2. Cost of issuance benefit to Lemoore. The City would receive a one-time fiscal consultant fee of \$25,000 as part of costs of issuance for costs for the refunding (subject to State approval), similar to what was approved on the refunding of other Successor Agency bonds in 2014.

3. Availability of 2011 Bond Proceeds for City Projects. Under SB 107, the City would be authorized to spend up to 35% of the original bond proceeds on previouslyenumerated projects, as opposed to retaining the funds in escrow or calling the bonds. Potential projects the funds could be used for (as outlined in the initial issuance documents) include street improvements near Bush Street and State Route 41); Watewater Treatment Plant engineering, design and construction; Cedar Lane extension and right-of-way acquisition; police and fire dispatch center; highway and wayfinding signage; Americans with Disabilities Act compliant sidewalks; and widening of Hanford Armona Road from State Route 41 to 19th Avenue.

To move forward, the board of the Lemoore Successor Agency must approve a resolution authorizing the refunding of the 2011 Bonds. Thereafter, staff would request a meeting of the Oversight Board for Successor Agency to the Former Lemoore Redevelopment Agency to provide similar approval. While certain details for implementing SB 107 must still be determined by the CDOF, it is staff's understanding that there will be a 100-day review for any petitions to spend proceeds under SB 107, as well as the requisite 60-day review of any Successor Agency debt refinancing's (staff believes they will run concurrently). Accordingly, staff does not expect approval by the State until April or May 2016, which will allow completion of the refinancing shortly thereafter.

Financial Consideration(s):

If the Last and Final ROPS is approved by CDOF, bond proceeds of approximately \$4,650,000 will be available for the Successor Agency to spend on projects and approximately \$1,160,000 will be available to the Lemoore Housing Authority for Low & Moderate income projects for the City. The bond proceeds must be expended on projects that were included in the original bond covenants.

In addition to the bond proceeds, the proposed refunding of the 2011 Bonds would provide the estimated \$2,800,000 savings on debt payments over the next 25 years (or \$6,550,000 on a net present value basis, taking into account the bond redemption). The proposed refunding would defer principal payments until 2034, in part to obtain greater savings now, and in part to take advantage of the increased assessed valuations between now and 2034. Also, the 2016 Lemoore Tax Allocation Refunding Bonds would be scheduled to be paid in full as of August 1, 2040, the same final maturity date as the *"In God We Trust"*

existing 2011 Bonds. This will result in an increase in the annual excess tax increment available to be distributed to the taxing entities over the next 25 years, due in part to the reduces interest costs.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Alternatives include redeeming 100% of the 2011 Bonds at the earliest call date of August 2016; redeeming 95% and refunding 5% of the 2011 Bonds to be expended on projects, as allowed by SB 107 or redeeming 65% and refunding 35% of the bond proceeds for projects, as allowed by SB 107.

Pros:

- If successful in obtaining an approved Last and Final ROPS under SB 107, the Successor Agency would have access to approximately \$4,650,000 for City projects and \$1,160,000 for Lemoore Housing Authority Low & Moderate projects.
- The savings from the refunding will generate an annual increase in the excess tax increment that will be distributed to the taxing entities, including the City of Lemoore.
- Potential projects may indirectly cause an increase in future assessed valuations. The projects may improve city infrastructure that is needed to allow new development within the city.

Cons:

• None noted.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the board of the Successor Agency adopt Resolution No. 2016-01, which would approve the form and documents relating to the Issuance and Sale of 2016 Tax Allocation Refunding Bonds to Refinance Outstanding 2011 Bonds of the Former Lemoore Redevelopment Agency, and approving related matters and official actions.

A RESOLUTION OF THE SUCCESSOR AGENCY TO THE LEMOORE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY APPROVING THE ISSUANCE OF REFUNDING BONDS IN ORDER TO REFUND CERTAIN OUTSTANDING BONDS OF THE FORMER LEMOORE REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY, APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN INDENTURE OF TRUST RELATING THERETO, APPROVING THE EXECUTION AND DELIVERY OF AN ESCROW AGREEMENT RELATING TO THE BONDS BEING REFUNDED, REQUESTING OVERSIGHT BOARD APPROVAL OF THE ISSUANCE OF THE REFUNDING BONDS, REQUESTING CERTAIN DETERMINATIONS BY THE OVERSIGHT BOARD, AND PROVIDING FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATING THERETO

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 34172(a) of the California Health and Safety Code (unless otherwise noted, Section references hereinafter being to such Code), the Lemoore Redevelopment Agency (the "Former Agency") has been dissolved and no longer exists as a public body, corporate and politic, and pursuant to Section 34173 of the Code, the City Council of the City of Lemoore (the "City") has become the successor entity to the Former Agency (the "Successor Agency"); and

WHEREAS, the Former Agency was a public body, corporate and politic, duly established and authorized to transact business and exercise powers under and pursuant to the provisions of the Community Redevelopment Law of the State of California, constituting Part 1 of Division 24 of the Health and Safety Code of the State (the "Law"); and

WHEREAS, a redevelopment plan for the redevelopment project area designated the "Lemoore Redevelopment Project" in the City of Lemoore, California (the "Redevelopment Project") was adopted in compliance with all requirements of the Law; and

WHEREAS, prior to dissolution of the Former Agency, the Former Agency issued its Lemoore Redevelopment Agency (Kings County, California), Lemoore Redevelopment Project, 2011 Tax Allocation Bonds in the initial aggregate principal amount of \$19,150,000 (the "Prior Bonds") in order to raise funds for programs, projects and activities relating to the Redevelopment Project; and

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill X1 26, effective June 29, 2011 ("AB 26"), together with AB 1484, effective June 27, 2012 ("AB 1484" and, collectively with AB 26, the "Existing Dissolution Act"), resulted in the dissolution of the Former Agency as of February 1, 2012, and the vesting in the Successor Agency of all of the authority, rights, powers, duties and obligations of the Former Agency; and

WHEREAS, Senate Bill 107 ("SB 107"), effective September 22, 2015, makes technical and substantive amendments to the Existing Dissolution Act (the Existing Dissolution Act as amended by SB 107 is referred to as the "Dissolution Act"); and

WHEREAS, SB 107 modifies Section 34191.4(c)(2), by, among other things, (i) allowing thirty five percent (35%) of the proceeds derived from the Prior Bonds, in excess of the amounts needed to satisfy approved enforceable obligations (the "Spendable Proceeds"), to be used in a manner consistent with the original bond covenants, so long as the Successor Agency has an approved Last and Final Recognized Obligation Payment Schedule pursuant to Section 34191.6, and (ii) directing that all remaining bond proceeds (other than the Spendable Proceeds) must be used at the earliest date permissible under the applicable bond covenants to defease the Prior Bonds or to purchase those same outstanding Prior Bonds on the open market for cancellation; and

WHEREAS, Section 34177.5 authorizes the Successor Agency to issue refunding bonds pursuant to Article 11 (commencing with Section 53580) of Chapter 3 of Part 1 of Division 2 of Title 5 of the Government Code (the "Refunding Law") for the purpose of achieving debt service savings within the parameters set forth in Section 34177.5(a)(1) (the "Savings Parameters"); and

WHEREAS, to determine compliance with the Savings Parameters for purposes of the issuance by the Successor Agency of its Successor Agency to the Lemoore Redevelopment Agency, 2015 Allocation Refunding Bonds (Lemoore Redevelopment Project) (the "Refunding Bonds"), the Successor Agency has caused its financial advisor, Acacia Financial Group, Inc. (the "Financial Advisor"), to prepare an analysis of the potential savings that will accrue to the Successor Agency and to applicable taxing entities as a result of the use of the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds to refund the Prior Bonds (the "Debt Service Savings Analysis"); and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency desires at this time to approve the issuance of the Refunding Bonds and to approve the form of and authorize the execution and delivery of the Indenture of Trust, by and between the Successor Agency and a trustee to be selected by the Successor Agency, as provided below, providing for the issuance of the Refunding Bonds (the "Indenture"), and the Escrow Agreement to be delivered to U.S. Bank National Association, as trustee for the Prior Bonds, to be dated as of the date of the issuance and delivery of the Refunding Bonds (the "Escrow Agreement"); and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency is now requesting that the Oversight Board direct the Successor Agency to undertake the refunding proceedings and to approve the issuance of the Refunding Bonds pursuant to this Resolution and the Indenture; and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency further requests that the Oversight Board make certain determinations described below on which the Successor Agency will rely in undertaking the refunding proceedings and the issuance of the Refunding Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Successor Agency has determined to sell the Refunding Bonds to Hilltop Securities Inc. (the "Original Purchaser") pursuant to the terms of the Bond Purchase Agreement (the "Purchase Agreement") to be entered into by the Successor Agency and the Original Purchaser; and

WHEREAS, following approval by the Oversight Board of the issuance of the Refunding Bonds by the Successor Agency and upon submission of the Oversight Board Resolution to the California Department of Finance, the Successor Agency will, with the assistance of its Disclosure Counsel and the Financial Advisor to the Successor Agency, cause to be prepared a form of Official Statement for the Refunding Bonds describing the Refunding Bonds and containing material information relating to the Successor Agency and the Refunding Bonds, the preliminary form of which will be submitted to the Successor Agency for approval for distribution by the Original Purchaser, as underwriter of the Refunding Bonds, to persons and institutions interested in purchasing the Refunding Bonds.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Successor Agency to the Lemoore Redevelopment Agency, as follows:

Section 1. Recitals. The Recitals set forth above are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference.

Section 2. Determination of Savings; Compliance with Section 34177.5(a)(1). The Successor Agency has determined that there are significant potential savings available to the Successor Agency and to applicable taxing entities in compliance with the Savings Parameters by the issuance by the Successor Agency of the Refunding Bonds to provide funds to refund and defease part or all of the Prior Bonds, all as evidenced by the Debt Service Savings Analysis on file with the Successor Agency, which Debt Service Savings Analysis is hereby approved. In addition, the Refunding Bonds shall only be issued if the Refunding Bonds comply with the provisions of Section 34177.5(a)(1), including limiting the amount of the Refunding Bonds to the amount required to refund the Prior Bonds, and to pay the costs of issuing the Refunding Bonds, which may include amounts required to purchase bond insurance and a reserve fund surety bond for the Refunding Bonds.

Section 3. Approval of Issuance of the Refunding Bonds. The Successor Agency hereby authorizes and approves the issuance of the Refunding Bonds under the Law and the Refunding Law in an aggregate principal amount of not to exceed \$8,300,000, provided that the Refunding Bonds are in compliance with the Savings Parameters and all other requirements of Section 34177.5 at the time of sale and delivery.

Section 4. Approval of Indenture. The Successor Agency hereby approves the Indenture prescribing the terms and provisions of the Refunding Bonds and the application of the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds. Each of the Mayor, the City Manager or the Finance Director, on behalf of the Successor Agency (each, an "Authorized Officer"), is hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver, and the City Clerk of the City, on behalf of the Successor Agency, is hereby authorized and directed to attest to, the Indenture for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, in substantially the form on file with the Successor Agency, with such changes therein, deletions therefrom and additions thereto as the Authorized Officer executing the same shall approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery of the Indenture. The Authorized Officers are hereby directed and authorized to select a trustee for the Refunding Bonds. The Successor Agency hereby authorizes the delivery and performance of the Indenture.

Section 5. Approval of Escrow Agreement. The form of the Escrow Agreement on file with the Successor Agency is hereby approved and the Authorized Officers are, each acting alone,

hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, to execute and deliver the Escrow Agreement. The Successor Agency hereby authorizes the delivery and performance of its obligations under the Escrow Agreement.

Section 6. Oversight Board Approval of the Issuance of the Bonds. The Successor Agency hereby requests the Oversight Board, as authorized by Section 34177.5(f), to direct the Successor Agency to undertake the refunding proceedings and as authorized by Section 34177.5(f) and Section 34180 to approve the issuance of the Refunding Bonds pursuant to Section 34177.5(a)(1) and this Resolution and the Indenture.

Section 7. Appointment of Consultants. The Successor Agency hereby appoints The Weist Law Firm as Bond and Disclosure Counsel, Acacia Financial Group, Inc. as Financial Advisor, and Hilltop Securities Inc. as Underwriter. An Authorized Officer is authorized and directed to execute an agreement with each of such firms in the respective forms on file with the Secretary.

Section 8. Determinations by the Oversight Board. The Successor Agency requests that the Oversight Board make the following determinations upon which the Successor Agency will rely in undertaking the refunding proceedings and the issuance of the Refunding Bonds:

(a) The Successor Agency is authorized, as provided in Section 34177.5(f), to recover its costs related to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds from the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds, including the cost of reimbursing its administrative staff for time spent with respect to the authorization, issuance, sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds;

(b) The application of proceeds of the Refunding Bonds by the Successor Agency to the refunding and defeasance of the Prior Bonds, as well as the payment by the Successor Agency of costs of issuance of the Refunding Bonds, as provided in Section 34177.5(a), shall be implemented by the Successor Agency promptly upon sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds, notwithstanding Section 34177.3 or any other provision of law to the contrary, without the approval of the Oversight Board, the California Department of Finance, the Kings County Auditor-Controller or any other person or entity other than the Successor Agency;

(c) The Successor Agency shall be entitled to receive its full Administrative Cost Allowance under Section 34181(a)(3) without any deductions with respect to continuing costs related to the Refunding Bonds, such as trustee's fees, auditing and fiscal consultant fees and continuing disclosure and rating agency costs (collectively, "Continuing Costs of Issuance"), and such Continuing Costs of Issuance shall be payable from property tax revenues pursuant to Section 34183. In addition and as provided by Section 34177.5(f), if the Successor Agency is unable to complete the issuance of the Refunding Bonds for any reason, the Successor Agency shall, nevertheless, be entitled to recover its costs incurred with respect to the refunding proceedings of the Refunding Bonds from such property tax revenues pursuant to Section 34183 without reduction in its Administrative Cost Allowance.

Section 9. <u>Filing of Debt Service Savings Analysis and Resolution</u>. The Successor Agency is hereby authorized and directed to file the Debt Service Savings Analysis, together with

a certified copy of this Resolution, with the Oversight Board, and, as provided in Section 34180(j) with the Kings County Administrative Officer, the Kings County Auditor-Controller and the California Department of Finance.

Section 10. Sale of Refunding Bonds. The Successor Agency hereby approves the Purchase Agreement. The Authorized Officers, each acting alone, are hereby authorized and directed to execute and deliver the Purchase Agreement for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, in substantially the form on file with the Successor Agency, with such changes therein, deletions therefrom and additions thereto as the Authorized Officer executing the same shall approve, such approval to be conclusively evidenced by the execution and delivery of the Purchase Agreement.

Section 11. Issuance of Refunding Bonds in Whole or in Part. It is the intent of the Successor Agency to sell and deliver the Refunding Bonds in whole, provided that there is compliance with the Savings Parameters. However, the Successor Agency will initially authorize the sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds in whole or, if such Savings Parameters cannot be met with respect to the whole, then in part; provided that the Refunding Bonds so sold and delivered in part are in compliance with the Savings Parameters. The sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds that meet the Savings Parameters. In the event the Refunding of that portion of the Refunding Bonds that meet the Savings Parameters. In the event the Refunding Bonds are initially sold in part, the Successor Agency intends to sell and deliver additional parts of the Refunding Bonds without the prior approval of the Oversight Board provided that in each such instance the Refunding Bonds so sold and delivered in part are in compliance so sold and delivered in part are in compliance sold and delivered in part are sold in part.

Section 12. Subordination Agreements. The Successor Agency is hereby directed, at the discretion of an Authorized Officer, to request subordination of its pass-through obligations to taxing entities and the Authorized Officers are, each acting alone, hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, to execute and deliver subordination agreements as are necessary and applicable with such taxing entities. The Successor Agency hereby authorizes the delivery and performance of its obligations under such subordination agreements.

Section 13. Municipal Bond Insurance and Surety Bonds. The Authorized Officers, each acting alone, are hereby authorized and directed to take all actions necessary to obtain a municipal bond insurance policy for the Refunding Bonds and reserve account surety bonds for the Refunding Bonds from a municipal bond insurance company if it is determined, upon consultation with the Financial Advisor and the Original Purchaser, that such municipal bond insurance policy and/or surety bonds will be economic to reduce the true interest costs with respect to the Refunding Bonds.

Section 14. Approval of Official Statement. Following approval by the Oversight Board of the issuance of the Refunding Bonds by the Successor Agency and upon submission of the Oversight Board Resolution to the California Department of Finance, the Successor Agency will, with the assistance of its Disclosure Counsel, Fiscal Consultant and Financial Advisor, cause to be prepared a form of Official Statement for the Refunding Bonds describing the Refunding Bonds

and containing material information relating to the Successor Agency and the Refunding Bonds, the preliminary form of which will be submitted to the Successor Agency for approval for distribution by the Original Purchaser to persons and institutions interested in purchasing the Refunding Bonds.

Section 15. Official Actions. All actions heretofore taken by the officers and agents of the Successor Agency with respect to the issuance of the Refunding Bonds are hereby approved, confirmed and ratified. Each Authorized Officers and any and all other officers of the Successor Agency are hereby authorized and directed, for and in the name and on behalf of the Successor Agency, to do any and all things and take any and all actions, including execution and delivery of any and all assignments, certificates, requisitions, including requisitions for the payment of costs of issuance of the Refunding Bonds, agreements, including agreements in customary form providing for the investment of the proceeds of the Refunding Bonds, notices, consents, and other documents, which they, or any of them, may deem necessary or advisable in (i) obtaining the requested approvals by the Oversight Board and the California Department of Finance, (ii) obtaining the subordination of any pass-through or tax sharing agreements, (iii) the issuance, sale and delivery of the Refunding Bonds, and (iv) the refunding and defeasance of the Prior Bonds. Whenever in this Resolution any officer of the Successor Agency is directed to execute or countersign any document or take any action, such execution, countersigning or action may be taken on behalf of such officer by any person designated by such officer to act on his or her behalf in the case such officer is absent or unavailable.

Section 16. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect from and after the date of approval and adoption thereof.

Proposed Motion:

Adopt Ordinance No. 2016-02 modifying the term length of the Downtown Merchants Advisory Committee to two years with alternating term limits.

Committee reference Terms

Subject/Discussion:

Section 5, Chapter 2, Title 3 of the Lemoore Municipal Code requires that each member of the Downtown Merchants Advisory Committee (DMAC) serve for a term of one (1) year. The DMAC is recommending a change in the membership term length from one (1) year to two (2) years with alternating terms. The change will allow approximately one-half of the DMAC to remain seated to ensure continuity and institutional knowledge.

City Code section 3-2-5, Downtown Merchants Advisory Committee, language is listed below.

CURRENT LANGUAGE:

For the sole purpose of advising the council and making recommendations on the operation and extent of the area, the methods and ways in which the revenue derived from the assessment imposed by this chapter shall be used within the scope of the purposes set forth in this chapter, and to have and to perform such other powers and duties as the council may determine, there shall be created an advisory committee, which shall consist of nine (9) members to be appointed by the mayor with the concurrence of the city council for a term of one year, to serve at the pleasure of the mayor and city council, said members to be persons who own or are employed in businesses within the area. (Ord. 2003-03, 3-18-2003)

PROPOSED LANGUAGE:

For the sole purpose of advising the City Council and making recommendations on the operation and extent of the area, the methods and ways in which the revenue derived from the assessment imposed by this chapter shall be used within the scope of the purposes set forth in this chapter, and to have and to perform such other powers and duties as the council may determine, there shall be created an advisory committee, which shall consist of nine (9) members with applications to be approved by City Council by a

majority vote for a term of two (2) calendar years having alternating expiration dates. The terms of office shall expire at eleven fifty-nine (11:59) P.M. on December 31 of the last year of each member's term of office. Members shall be persons who own or are employed in businesses within the downtown area. Members of the advisory committee shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor and city council, and may be removed by the (a) expiration of term, or (b) majority vote of the City Council. Should no appointments be made by the expiration of term, the member will remain in office until an appointment is made.

The nine (9) members shall be appointed for two (2) year staggered terms, as follows; in the year 2016, four (4) members shall be appointed and shall serve for one (1) year; five (5) members shall serve for two (2) years. At the expiration of the said terms, the terms of all appointed members of the Committee shall be two (2) years.

Financial Consideration(s):

Not Applicable.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

The options are as follows:

- 1. After the ordinance change becomes effective, Council could choose to identify five current DMAC members serving a one-year term and appoint those members to a two-year term. The remaining members would continue serving their one-year term through the end of 2016, and would need to reapply for a two-year term if they desired appointment to the Committee.
- 2. Another option would be for the City Council to wait until the 2017 appointments are made and determine at that time which members will serve only a one-year term.
- 3. Council could keep the term length for all members at one year.

Commission/Board Recommendation:

The Downtown Merchants Advisory Board recommends changing the membership term from one year to two years.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE AMENDING SECTION 5 OF CHAPTER 2 OF TITLE 3 OF THE LEMOORE MUNICIPAL CODE PERTAINING TO THE DOWNTOWN MERCHANTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The City Council of the City of Lemoore does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 5 of Chapter 2 of Title 3 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended to read as follows:

For the sole purpose of advising the council and making recommendations on the operation and extent of the area, the methods and ways in which the revenue derived from the assessment imposed by this chapter shall be used within the scope of the purposes set forth in this chapter, and to have and to perform such other powers and duties as the council may determine, there shall be created an advisory committee, which shall consist of nine (9) members to be appointed by the mayor with the concurrence of the city council for a term of one year, to serve at the pleasure of the mayor and city council, said members to be persons who own or are employed in businesses within the area. (Ord. 2003-03, 3-18-2003)

For the sole purpose of advising the council and making recommendations on the operation and extent of the area, the methods and ways in which the revenue derived from the assessment imposed by this chapter shall be used within the scope of the purposes set forth in this chapter, and to have and to perform such other powers and duties as the council may determine, there shall be created an advisory committee, which shall consist of nine (9) members with applications to be approved by City Council by a majority vote for a term of two (2) calendar years having alternating expiration dates. The terms of office shall expire at eleven fifty-nine (11:59) P.M. on December 31 of the last year of each member's term of office. Members shall be persons who own or are employed in businesses within the downtown area. Members of the advisory committee shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor and city council, and may be removed by the (a) expiration of term, or (b) majority vote of the city council. Should no appointments be made by the expiration of term, the member will remain in office until an appointment is made.

The nine (9) members shall be appointed for two (2) year staggered terms, as follows; in the year 2016, four (4) members shall be appointed and shall serve for one (1) year; five (5) members shall serve for two (2) years. At the expiration of the said terms, the terms of all appointed members of the Committee shall be two (2) years.

SECTION 2. This Ordinance shall take effect thirty (30) days after its adoption.

SECTION 3. The City Clerk is further directed to cause this ordinance or a summary of this ordinance to be published once in a newspaper of general circulation published and circulated within the City of Lemoore, within fifteen (15) days after its adoption. If a summary of the ordinance is published, then the City Clerk shall cause a certified copy of the full text of the proposed ordinance to be posted in the office of the City Clerk at least five days prior to the Council meeting at which the ordinance is adopted and again after the meeting at which the ordinance is adopted. The summary shall be approved by the City Attorney.
