

Whitten on Addendum to Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration for Lennar Homes Tract 920 and Riley Jones Property, Major Site Plan Review No. 2017-01, Annexation No. 2017-01, Lennar Homes (APNs 021-570-001 and 021-569-001) and Riley Jones Residence (APN 023-100-007), (About the Water Issues)

Dear Mayor and City Council Members:

These Comments follow my Comments filed with the City Clerk on July 10, 2017 and Supplemental Comments filed August 14, 2017, regarding the above-referenced proceedings being considered both by the Lemoore Planning Commission and the Lemoore City Council (the "Project"). Although I currently reside in the San Francisco Bay Area, I am the trustee of farmland held by a Whitten family trust located on Hanford-Armona Road near the Lemoore property proposed to be developed, and am interested in the feasibility, costs and requirements to extend city services across Hanford-Armona Road to accommodate new development, and whether those services will be of adequate quality, and how development will affect nearby agricultural uses.

Water issues permeate the discussions of this Project. The issue of water is very important to the City of Lemoore ("City") and its future development, and will be a primary focus of these comments. The City has approved an initial Mitigated Negative Declaration ("MND"), but that initial MND failed to address farmland impacts.

1) <u>The issue of irrigation</u>: The Addendum adds a brief discussion of the potential agricultural use of the Tract 920 property, including soil rating (class II, if irrigated), but states, without much factual inquiry, that the fact that the Project site is surrounded by urban development on three sides makes "it difficult to determine if the site could be feasibly irrigated," and speculates about the cost of drilling a well, or of obtaining surface water rights and constructing pipelines "may be enough to question whether irrigation is feasible" but concludes that the land would be prime agricultural land if irrigation is feasible (Addendum at page 13). The Addendum does not state whether such an inquiry about feasibility was made (if so, it is not discussed), and it is clear from the map provided with the

project that there is an orchard directly behind the proposed Project—presumably irrigated. The Addendum concludes "no new environmental impacts" without much detailed discussion, and does not address the impact of the proposed development on the adjacent agricultural land (the aforementioned adjacent orchard).

- 2) The issue of water access: The engineer for the proposed Project testified at the August 14, 2017 Planning Commission Public Hearing that the Lennar Project would rely on City water, by hooking up to some nearby City water facilities. There was some discussion about whether additional pumps and related facilities would be necessary to provide City water to Tract 920, but no details have been publicly presented, to my knowledge, particularly about how such needed improvements might be funded. The Kings County Local Formation Commission ("LAFCO"), in its Appendix A, Application Checklist, requires that the City provide a Complete Plan for Services Form that includes an enumeration and description of services to be extended to the affected territory, the level and range of those services, an indication of when those services can feasibly be extended, an indication of improvements or upgrading of structures, roads, sewer or water facilities, and, significantly, information about how those services will be financed. By this letter, I request a copy of the City's filled-out Complete Plan for Services Form be provided to me by e-mail at pawhitten@pawhitten.com when it is available.
- 3) The issue of water quality: As this Council may be painfully aware, the City water system has failed several recent drinking water quality tests (See, e.g. "Important Information about Your Drinking Water, City of Lemoore has Levels of Total Trihalomethanes above Drinking Water Standards," distributed July 28, 2017, available as a PDF file at http://www.lemoore.com/water.htm, and attached hereto). Trihalomethanes have long been known to increase cancer risk (See, e.g. "What are trihalomethanes?," an article from the Spring 1999 issue of "On Tap," from the Morgantown, West Virginia National Drinking Water Clearinghouse (attached). Apparently, the City is working on a three-year plan (emphasis added) to improve City water to meet drinking water guality standards, but meanwhile it might be important to provide notice to LAFCO (and potential new residents and developers seeking to use City water) that the City water currently does not meet water guality standards. Immediate improvements need to be made, because any delay in meeting the standards puts new and existing residents, visitors and all who drink the City tap water on a regular basis at increased cancer risk (emphasis added).
- 4) <u>The issue of the MND 3.13(b) Groundwater Depletion</u>: The Addendum corrects some typographical errors and omissions in Sections 2 and 3 of the initial MND, but does not address the failure, in the Section 3.13 (b) Hydrology and Water Quality (groundwater depletion question) to check a box stating whether the Project would have an impact (no box was checked on page 59, second series of boxes). The discussion on page 61 does have a brief discussion about the City's

existing water system, and discusses supply capacity for building the Project, but it doesn't appear to discuss what impact so many new users of City water would have upon the already poor water quality of the City water system, and whether and when the City water system will be improved to have adequate water quality, and what such improvements would cost (and whether building facilities for new development will delay needed improvements to water quality for other City residents). This omission is significant and must be addressed before LAFCO can conclude that the City can provide adequate water quality to the sites that are proposed to be annexed.

5) The issue of Riley Jones' water: The record discusses Riley Jones effort to seek and successfully obtain connection to City water because of difficulty obtaining adequate and quality well water at his residence in his Kings County neighborhood, the Country Club Estates. For completeness of the record, the documents discussing previous actions by the LAFCO and the City accompany these Comments. The Addendum and MND both state that LAFCO conditioned its approval on annexation, but the written record doesn't appear to support that assertion. It appears that the City is aware that Mr. Jones property and the Lennar project are not in physical proximity, and that the Jones property is already connected to City water. It is not clear that the CEQA newspaper notice correctly provided notice that Mr. Jones' property would be included in in MND. Combining annexation of his one house in the Country Club Estates neighborhood in the County on the south side of town, with a new proposed development on the north side of town, may not give residents adequate notice of the actions the City and LAFCO are taking with respect to the two separate annexations.

There are a variety of other issues to consider, but the drinking water quality issue is primary. Thank you for your thoughtful consideration of these matters. I hope for the sake of the City and its current and future residents that you can obtain adequate funding and other resources to address the City's water quality issues.

City of Lemoore has Levels of Total Trihalomethanes above Drinking Water Standards

The City of Lemoore water system recently failed a drinking water standard. Although this is not an emergency, as water customers, you have a right to know what you should do, what happened, and what the City is doing to correct the situation. The City routinely monitors for the presence of drinking water contaminants. During the second quarter of 2017, testing results showed that the system exceeded the standard or maximum contaminant level for Total Trihalomethanes and Haloacetic Acids. The standards for Total Trihalomethanes (TTHM) is 80 micrograms per liter (ug/L – parts per billion) and Haloacetic Acids (HAA5) are and 60 micrograms per liter (ug/L – parts per billion), respectively.

What do I need to do?

- You do not need to use an alternative (such as bottled or boiled) water.
- This is not an immediate risk. If there was any risk, customers would be notified immediately.
 Some people who drink water-containing trihalomethanes over many years in excess of the standard may experience liver,
 kidney, or central nervous system problems, and may have an increased risk of cancer.

What are trihalomethanes?

The use of chlorine to disinfect water produces various disinfection byproducts, which have been classified mainly as halogenated and non-halogenated byproducts. These primary byproducts are trihalomethanes (THMs) and haloacetic acids. THMs are the byproducts of chlorination of water that contains natural organic matter. A U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) survey shows that THMs are present in most chlorinated water supplies. Even though they pose a less acute health risk than do waterborne diseases, THMs are still among the important water quality issues.

The most common THM compounds are dibromochloromethane (CHClBr₂), bromoform (CHBr₃), chloroform (CHCl₃), and dichlorobromomethane (CHCl₂Br). The sum of these four compounds is referred to as Total Trihalomethanes (TTHMs).

Why and how are THMs formed?

When chlorine is added to water with organic material, such as algae, river weeds, and decaying leaves, THMs are formed. Residual chlorine molecules react with this harmless organic material to form a group of chlorinated chemical compounds, THMs. They are tasteless and odorless, but harmful and potentially toxic.

The quantity of byproducts formed is determined by several factors, such as the amount and type of organic material present in water, temperature, pH, chlorine dosage, contact time available for chlorine, and bromide concentration in the water.

The organic matter in water mainly consists of a) humic substance, which is the organic portion of soil that remains after prolonged microbial decomposition formed by the decay of leaves, wood, and other vegetable matter; and b) fulvic acid, which is a water soluble substance of low molecular weight that is derived from humus.

At what levels are THMs present in water?

The byproduct concentration is mainly determined by the amount of organic material in the source water. Water facilities that draw water from surface water (lakes, rivers, and reservoirs) produce water with higher levels of THMs than facilities with groundwater (wells and springs) as their source of water. TTHM concentrations range from 0.030 to 0.150 milligrams per liter (mg/l) in surface water and 0.001 to 0.010 mg/l in groundwater. The distribution of these four compounds varies with bromide concentration in water.

EPA is currently regulating TTHMs for small communities as part of the Microbial/ Disinfection and Disinfection Byproducts (M/DBP) Rules. Under these rules the allowable TTHM concentrations are 0.080 mg/l of TTHMs, and there are plans to reduce these limits to 0.040 mg/l by the year 2002.

What are the health effects of THMs?

According to a University of Florida report, exposure to THMs may pose an increased risk of cancer. According to Rebekah Grossman, two THMs, chloroform and dibromochloromethane, are carcinogens; and another THM, bromodichloromethane, has been identified as a mutagen, which alters DNA. Mutagens are considered to affect the genetics of future generations in addition to being carcinogenic. A California study indicates that THMs may be responsible for reproductive problems and miscarriage. The study found a miscarriage rate of 15.7 percent for women who drank five or more glasses of cold water containing more than 0.075 mg/l TTHM, compared to a miscarriage rate of 9.5 percent for women with low TTHM exposure. In addition to these risks, TTHMs are linked to bladder cancer, heart, lungs, kidney, liver, and central nervous system damage.

Then why were THMs not regulated for small communities earlier?

The earlier THM regulations only applied to larger systems (those serving more than 10,000 people). EPA, keeping the following factors in mind, believed that exempting smaller systems would not negatively affect the health of small community people because:

- a) The majority of smaller systems use groundwater as their source;
- b) Small systems usually use less detention time and hence less contact time;
- c) Lack of required professional expertise to control the THMs and the necessity of disinfection; and
- d) Small systems often use less chlorine.

How can systems reduce THMs?

Drinking water systems can reduce THM formation in several ways. *Continued on next page*

Newsletter Provides Biosolids Information

How to best treat and dispose of the residual waste materials that result from wastewater treatment processes (sewage sludge and domestic septage, for example) is a hot topic in many small communities. By managing these wastes as biosolids in accordance with federal, state, and local regulations, communities often can cost-effectively recycle and beneficially apply these wastes to improve soils or to rehabilitate land damaged by mining or other industries.

The Fall 1998 issue of *Pipeline* presents a brief overview of the options small communities have for managing biosolids and some of the requirements of the federal Part 503 regulations. It also includes information about the safety and

a) Reduce the organic material before chlorinating the water. Treatment techniques, such as coagulation,

sedimentation, and filtration can remove most of the organic materials. However, activated carbon can be used to remove greater amounts of organic material than can be removed by other techniques.

- b) Optimize chlorine usage.
- c) Change the point of chlorine addition in the treatment series.
 If the point of chlorine addition is moved to a location after sedimentation or filtration, THM production can be reduced as these processes remove parts of the organic matter.
- d) Use alternative disinfection methods.
 Using a mixture of chlorine and ammonia (chloramine) reduces THM formation.
 Chloramine also disinfects, but doesn't form THMs. Ozone can be used along with chlorine and chloramine. Chlorine dioxide is another alternative. The combination of disinfectants not only reduces the formation of THMs, but also maintains the residual concentration in the distribution system. But changing the disinfectant may alter the whole treatment process and might affect the removal of other contaminants.
- e) Other methods: These include filtration, aeration, boiling, distillation, commercial home treatment systems or filters, nanofiltration, activated

2016 CITY OF LEMOORE WATER QUALITY CONSUMER CONFIDENCE REPORT

We are pleased to provide you with this year's Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) for the City of Lemoore. We want to keep you informed about the water quality and services we have delivered to you over the past year. Our goal is to provide you a safe and dependable supply of drinking water.

Water for the City of Lemoore is produced from ten groundwater wells, four in the well field north of town (Wells N-2, N-4, N-5, N-6), and six located within the City (Wells 7,10,11,12,13,14). There are also two standby wells (Wells 8, 9) south of town used seasonally for Olam Tomato Processors, Inc.

Source water assessments were conducted for Wells N-2, N-4, N-5, 8, 9, 10, 11 and 12 in July 2001, May 2005 and May 2011 and November 2011 for Wells 5, 11, 13 and 14 respectively. The sources are considered most vulnerable to the following activities not associated with contaminants detected in the water supply: above ground storage tanks, irrigated crops, home manufacturing, gas stations and sewer collection. A copy of the complete assessments may be requested by contacting the City of Lemoore Public Works Water Department at 711 Cinnamon Drive (559) 924-6744.

We test the drinking water quality for many constituents as required by State and Federal Regulations. This report shows the results of our monitoring for the period of January 1, 2015 through December 31, 2015 and describes what those results mean.

The City of Lemoore Water Division routinely monitors your drinking water for approximately 120 drinking water constituents. Only the detectable constituents are shown on this CCR. The table on the last page of this newsletter shows the results of our monitoring for the latest test results as required by State and Federal Laws. All drinking water, including bottled drinking water, may be reasonably expected to contain at least small amounts of some constituents. It is important to remember that the presence of these constituents does not necessarily pose a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline at 1-800-426-4791.

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally-occurring minerals and, in some cases, radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity. Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria that may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations and wildlife.
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, that can be naturally-occurring or result from urban storm water runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater discharges, oil and gas production, mining or farming.
- Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources such as agriculture, urban storm water runoff and residential uses.
- Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organic chemicals that are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban storm water runoff and septic systems.
- Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or be the result of oil and gas production and mining activities.
- Iron, which is a secondary standard in that it affects taste but does not have any health effects.
- If present, elevated levels of lead can cause serious health problems, especially for pregnant women and young children. Lead in drinking water is primarily from materials and components associated with service lines and home plumbing. The City of Lemoore is responsible for providing high quality drinking water, but cannot control the variety of materials used in the plumbing components. When your water has been sitting for several hours, you can minimize the potential for lead exposure by flushing your tap for 30 seconds to 2 minutes before using water for drinking or cooking. If you are concerned about lead in drinking water, you may wish to have your water

tested. Information on lead in drinking water, testing methods, and steps you can take to minimize exposure is available from the safe drinking water hotline or at <u>http://www.epa.gov/safewater/lead</u>.

In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, USEPA and the California Department of Public Health prescribe regulations that limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Department regulations also establish limits for contaminants in bottled water that must provide the same protection for public health.

Our water system recently failed a drinking water monitoring requirement. Although **this is not an emergency**, as our customers, you have a right to know what happened, what you should do and what we are doing to correct this situation.

We routinely monitor for the presence of drinking water contaminants As of Oct. 1, 2013 the Stage 2 Rule went into effect, in which compliance is based on a locational running annual average (LRAA), calculated individually for each sample site.

What should I do?

You do not need to use an alternative (e.g., bottled) water supply.

This is not an immediate risk. If it had been, you would have been notified immediately. However, some people who drink water containing trihalomethanes in excess of the MCL over many years may experience liver, kidney, or central nervous system problems, and may have an increased risk of getting cancer. If you have other health issues concerning the consumption of this water, you may wish to consult your doctor.

What was done?

The TTHM monitoring has shown that our water system's locational running annual average exceeded the TTHM MCL level of 80 ug/L at all four sample sites with annual running averages ranging from 98 ug/L to 109 ug/L for 2015. The City has undertaken some operational changes to try to reduce the TTHM's. As the test results come in we will be making the determinations to make a recommendation for changes to the system to correct the TTHM's levels. The City is working to be in compliance as soon as a plan is devised and improvements to our system infrastructure are complete.

The following table is being provided to you in cooperation with the State Department of Public Health. It shows the results of tests on Lemoore's water quality and compares them with established State Standards.

How to Read the Table

Our water is tested to ensure that it is safe and healthy. The column marked "COL (City of Lemoore) Level Detected" shows the average test results for the latest test performed for each contaminant. Sources of likely contaminant show where this substance usually originates. "Year Tested" is the latest test results available as some of the testing is done on three-year and five-year rotations.

We are proud that our drinking water meets or exceeds all Federal and State Requirements. We have learned through our monitoring and testing that some constituents have been detected. The EPA has determined that your water IS SAFE at these levels.

Additional Contaminants Monitored: Data reported in this table only includes regulated contaminants for which we have measurable levels from test results. We routinely perform additional monitoring of other contaminants that could pose health concerns. We have not had any detectable levels of any of those contaminants.

Unregulated Contaminants: The City of Lemoore is not required to and did not test for Cryptosporidium. This water contaminant is not found in groundwater sources, which is where the City of Lemoore pumps 100% of its water from.

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than the general population. Immunocompromised persons such as persons with cancer undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ, transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health providers. USEPA/Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines on appropriate means to lessen the risk of infection by Cryptosporidium and other microbial contaminants are available from the Safe Drinking Water Hotline (1-800-426-4791). Thank you for allowing us to continue providing your family with clean, quality water this year. In order to maintain a safe, high quality and dependable water supply, we have to make adjustments or take actions that benefit all of the customers. In order to insure good clean water in all areas of the system, Water Department personnel will be flushing water lines at various times. If you have a complaint regarding water quality, please call the Water Division at 924-6744. All water delivered meets the primary drinking water standards established by the California Department of Public Health Services and the United States Environmental Protection Agency. We, at the City of Lemoore, work around the clock to provide top quality and uninterrupted supply of water to every residence and business. We ask that all our customers help us protect our precious water resources, which are the heart of our community, and our children's future. The City Council for the City of Lemoore meets on the first and third Tuesdays of each month starting at 7:30 p.m.

DEFINITIONS OF THE UNITS OF MEASUREMENT AND TERMS

Maximum Contaminant Level (MCL) – The highest level of a contaminant that is allowed in drinking water. MCL's are set as close to the MCLG's as feasible using the best available treatment technology.

Maximum Contaminant Level Goal (MCLG) – The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. MCLG's provide a margin of safety.

Range - Variation of levels detected in test.

Public Health Goal (PHG) – The level of a contaminant in drinking water below which there is no known or expected risk to health. PHG's are set by the California Environmental Protection Agency.

Non-Detects (ND) - Laboratory analysis indicates that the constituent is not present.

Parts per million (ppm) or Milligrams per liter (mg/l) - one part per million corresponds to one minute in two years or a single penny in \$10,000.

Parts per billion (ppb) or Micrograms per liter (ug/l) - one part per billion corresponds to one minute in 2,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000.

Parts per trillion (ppt) or Nanograms per liter (nanograms/l) - one part per trillion corresponds to one minute in 2,000,000 years, or a single penny in \$10,000,000,000.

Parts per quadrillion (ppq) or Picograms per liter (picograms/l) – one part per quadrillion corresponds to one minute in 2,000,000,000 years or one penny in \$10,000,000,000.

Picocuries per liter (pCi/L) - picocuries per liter is a measure of the radioactivity in water.

Million fibers per Liter (MFL) - million fibers per liter is a measure of the presence of asbestos fibers that are longer than 10 micrometers.

Nephelometric Turbidity Unit (NTU) or (units) – nephelometric turbidity units is a measure of the clarity of water. Turbidity in excess of 5 NTU is just noticeable to the average person.

Regulatory Action Level (AL) – The concentration of a contaminant which, if exceeded, triggers treatment or other requirements which a water system must follow.

Not Available (NA) - No test results were found or water was not required to be tested for contaminant.

Treatment Technique (TT) - A treatment technique is a required process intended to reduce the level of a contaminant in drinking water.

Secondary Notification Requirements

Upon receipt of notification from a person operating a public water system, the following notification must be given within 10 days.

- SCHOOLS: Must notify school employees, students, and parents (if the students are minors).
- RESIDENTIAL RENTAL PROPERTY OWNERS OR MANAGERS (including nursing homes and care facilities): Must notify tenants.

EXTENSION OF SERVICE No. 15-01 CITY OF LEMOORE WATER SERVICE

I. BRIEF OVERVIEW OF PROPOSAL:

The Applicant, Mr. Riley Jones, has requested Commission approval to allow the City of Lemoore to extend water service outside its jurisdictional boundaries to serve his residence located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive (APN: 023-100-007). This property is within the Lemoore Primary Sphere of Influence and adjacent to the city limits. See Exhibit "A" for a location map of the project site. The Lemoore City Council has approved the request for the Lemoore Public Works Department to provide water service contingent upon LAFCO approval. An Agreement for connection to city water detailing the infrastructure cost breakdown is attached as Exhibit "B".

The applicant has informed the City of Lemoore and LAFCO that his private well located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive is failing and that attempts to drill additional wells on the property have been unsuccessful. Other than the City of Lemoore, no other municipal water service provider exists in close enough proximity to provide service to the residence.

The Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 allows a City to provide extended services outside its jurisdictional boundaries only if it first requests and receives written approval from LAFCO.

II. EXECUTIVE OFFICERS RECOMMENDATION

The Executive Officer recommends that LAFCO Extension of Service No. 15-01 "Mr. Riley Jones" be approved.

III. ANALYSIS OF PROPOSAL:

A. Discussion of Proposal

The purpose of the Commission's action is to authorize the City of Lemoore to provide water service outside of the City's jurisdiction and within their sphere of influence to a private residence located immediately south of the Lemoore City boundary. On August 4, 2015, the Lemoore City Council approved a property owner request to extend City water service to the residence located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive. The only municipal water service provider within close enough proximity to this parcel is the City of Lemoore which has an existing water line in the road right of way on the north side of Hotchkiss Drive.

The City already provides water service to the residences located North of Hotchkiss Drive directly across from the applicant's residence. Commission approval of the City to provide water service would allow the private residence located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive to receive reliable safe water service through the City's existing service line on Hotchkiss Drive.

B. Factors required by Government Code Section 56133:

Pursuant to Government Code Section 56133, Commission approval is required for extension of service by local agencies to territory outside of the agency's jurisdictional boundary. This section permits extension of service outside an agency's jurisdiction to respond to an existing public health threat.

The applicant has applied to enter into an agreement with the City of Lemoore to provide one water service connection to the residence located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive, which has no alternative water service provider available. The agreement is contingent upon LAFCO approval of an Extension of Service. The subject residence is within the sphere of influence of the City of Lemoore. The City's potable water infrastructure runs adjacent to the subject residence along Hotchkiss Drive.


1. Sphere Of Influence:

This extension of service is within the Primary Sphere of Influence of the City of Lemoore as adopted by the Commission January 1, 2008. The residence that would benefit from this service is located in the unincorporated Lemoore Fringe, adjacent to the existing City Limit Boundary.

2. Public Health Issue:

The existing residential ground water well is failing due to continuing drought conditions. The applicant has attempted to drill new wells but to date has failed to find additional water and lacks basic water to supply the home with a consistent supply of water for health and safety purposes.

Dear Mr. Gatzka,

The City of Lemoore received a request from Mr. Riley Jones (applicant) to provide water services to his residence located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive, Lemoore, CA. The property is located on the South side of Hotchkiss Drive in Kings County; Southeast of Highway 198 and Lemoore Avenue.

The applicant reported that his private well located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive is failing and he is requesting permission to tie into the existing water main located in the City right-of-way in front of his house. The applicant would be subject to all applicable City of Lemoore codes, regulations, fees and related requirements associate with the connection of City water services within the City of Lemoore service area.

The Lemoore City Council approved the applicant's request to connect to City water. The applicant is requesting Local Agency Formation Commission's (LAFCO) approval. The properties located on the north side of Hotchkiss Drive are within the City limits and already connected to City water, so the City will not have to install a main water line to accommodate Mr. Jones. The City is formally requesting LAFCO approval for extension of Services under Government Code Section 56133 to provide City water services at 285 Hotchkiss Drive; a property located within the City of Lemoore's Primary Sphere of Influence. Interest in water service and/or annexation by other property owners in the vicinity is mixed; however, the City of Lemoore anticipates that there may be future water service and/or annexation consideration, especially if drought conditions continue.

This approval is subject to the following conditions which are normal to all parties connecting to the water system within the City of Lemoore, except for the required approval by the County of Kings, which is applicable in this case.

- 1. Applicant to pay for the LAFCO Extension of Services fees.
- 2. Approval by the County of Kings for the applicant to connect to City Water Lines without annexation into the City of Lemoore.

- 3. The property owner will be required to pull a City of Lemoore plumbing and encroachment Permit to cover the following:
 - a. All work to be done in accordance with currently adopted State and local Building Codes and Standards.
 - b. Installation of a minimum 2" "Wet" water tap and water line per City of Lemoore Improvement Standards, located on Hotchkiss Drive, subject to approval by the County of Kings and the City of Lemoore.
 - c. Installation of a minimum 2" water meter per City of Lemoore Improvement Standards, at a location to be approved by both the County of Kings and the City of Lemoore at 285 Hotchkiss Drive.
 - d. Installation of a minimum 2" Approved Reduced Pressure Backflow Prevention Device per City of Lemoore Improvement Standards immediately after the installed water meter. The backflow device must be tested annually and a copy of the report shall be submitted to the City of Lemoore Public Works Department.

e. All normal City of Lemoore fees associated with this project must be paid.

- f. The applicant will enroll for City water service at the time the permit is pulled and issued.
- 4. The water connection, meter, and the backflow device will be located as close as possible to the water main located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive and in the same manner as others who have made similar connections to the City's mains for their individual water services, as approved by both the County of Kings and the City of Lemoore. The City will in no way be responsible for the backflow device, water line from the service connection at the tap into the main to the house or service connection from the meter to the applicant's residence.
- 5. All work and materials are to be provided at the sole expense of the applicant, except for the City of Lemoore installed water meter and box. The water meter and box will be installed when the Contractor extends the line.

AGREEMENT FOR CONNECTION TO CITY WATER

(Assessor's Parcel Number 023-100-007)

This Agreement for Connection to City Water ("Agreement") is entered into by and between the City of Lemoore ("City"), and Riley E. and Mary K. Jones ("Owners") with respect to the following recitals, which are a substantive part of this Agreement:

RECITALS

A. Owner owns certain real property in the County of Kings, State of California, known as Assessor's Parcel Number (APN) 023-100-007 and located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive, Lemoore (hereafter "Property"), which Property is legally described in Exhibit "A" and depicted in Exhibit "B" attached hereto.

B. The water well supplying water to the Property has deteriorated, and Owner desires that the Property be connected to the City water system for the purpose of using City water services; and

C. City is authorized under Government Code Section 56133 to enter into this Agreement, and request approval for such water service from Kings County LAFCo; and subject to Kings County LAFCo approval. City is willing to allow Owner to connect to the City water system in accordance with the provisions set forth in this Agreement.

D. Owner is willing to pay for all applicable permits, applications, and water connection fees associated with connecting to the City water system in accordance with the provisions set forth in this Agreement, as described in Exhibit "C".

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of mutual covenants, the parties agree as follows:

1. <u>Recitals</u>. The recitals above are true and incorporated by reference as a substantive part of this Agreement.

2. <u>Connection to Lemoore Water System; Abandonment of Well</u>. Subject to the Owner's full and complete performance of all of Owner's obligations and responsibilities under this Agreement, City authorizes Owner to connect to the City water main adjacent to the Property for purposes of connecting to the City municipal water system, and City agrees to provide Owner's Property with water from City's municipal water system. City's obligation is conditioned upon City and Owner obtaining the consent of all applicable governmental agencies including, without limitation, approval of an Extended or Outside Service Application by Kings County LAFCO and obtaining all consents from the County of Kings including, without limitation,

obtaining encroachment permits to install a water pipeline and related fixtures along the public right-of-way adjacent to the Property.

Owner shall submit plans to the City for approval and obtain all necessary permits prior to beginning construction of the connection to the City water main. Owner shall be solely responsible for paying all onetime expenses associated with the connection to the City water system, including all applicable water connection charges and permit fees required by the City Municipal Code, as amended. City shall approve the connection to the City water main before Owner may begin drawing water from the City water system. Upon completion and approval of the water connection to the Property, Owner will be subject to applicable City water service charges, and shall pay all required charges. All applicable City water service ordinances and standards in effect at the time shall govern and be complied with by Owner and Owner's successors, heirs, and assigns of Owner's interest in and to the Property and any part thereof.

3. <u>No Opposition to Annexation of Property</u>. Owner agrees not to oppose, protest, or otherwise object to any proceeding involving City's annexation of the Property, no matter whether such proceeding is before Kings County LAFCO, the City Council of Lemoore or any other legislative body, board or commission. Owner understands and agrees that this Agreement and the covenants contained herein are intended to be and shall act as a complete and irrevocable waiver of all such protest rights, whether or not such protest rights are sought to be exercised either as Owner of the Property which is the subject of the annexation proceedings, or as a registered voter residing on the Property which is the subject of the annexation proceedings. Owner shall not be responsible for any charges or fees associated with or related to annexation proceedings solely due to the fact that the Property is part of an area proposed for annexation by City. However, if Owner proposes a development for annexation by City whether or not including the Property, Owner may be subject to charges and fees associated with or related to such annexation proceedings, and nothing in this Agreement shall operate otherwise.

Owner further agrees that in the event (s)he or any other person or legal entity hereafter succeeding to Owner's interest in and to the Property or a part thereof seeks to protest the annexation contrary to and in breach of the provisions of this Agreement, City shall be entitled to take the following actions:

(1) In the event a protest to the annexation is filed with City, such protest shall be null and void and shall be disregarded by City in determining the value of all protests to such annexation.

(2) In the event a protest to the annexation is filed with Kings County LAFCO or any other board or commission, this Agreement shall act as a complete bar to the acceptance and consideration of such protest by Kings County LAFCO or other board or commission at such time as City files a copy of this Agreement with Kings County LAFCO or other board or commission.

4. <u>Voluntary Agreement</u>. The parties represent that they have read this Agreement in full and understand and voluntarily agree to all of the provisions herein. The parties further declare that prior to signing this Agreement they apprized themselves of relevant information, through sources of their own selection, including consultation with legal counsel of their choosing if so desired, in deciding whether to execute this Agreement. The parties further represent that they have, as of the date of execution of this Agreement, the legal capacity to understand, agree to, and sign this Agreement.

5. <u>Effect of Agreement</u>. This Agreement shall be recorded against the Property. This Agreement shall constitute a covenant running with the Property and each part thereof, shall be enforceable thereby, and shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Owner and City and the successors, heirs, and assigns of Owner's interest in and to the Property and any part thereof.

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



WHEREAS, on August 6, 2015, Mr. Riley Jones requested Commission approval for an extension of City water service to a single parcel located outside the jurisdictional boundaries of the City; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Riley Jones has stated that 285 Hotchkiss Drive is currently without an adequate supply of potable water which is considered to be a public health and safety issue.

WHEREAS, on August 26, 2015, this Commission at a regular meeting considered the proposed extension of water service; and

Dear Mayor Madrigal and Honorable Councilmembers:

As you are aware, this office represents the San Joaquin Valley Environmental Defense Center (SJVEDC), a California non-profit public benefit corporation, having its principal place of business in Visalia, California. My client represents the public interest in the proper land use planning and environmental review of the conversion of open space to urban development by local jurisdictions in the San Joaquin Valley.

With respect to the above-mentioned project which comes before you this evening, I was directed by my client to undertake a review of the public file, the City General Plan, and other documentation concerning this project. Per this instruction, I have reviewed the public file for this project, including the proposed land use entitlements and environmental review, pursuant to the California Environmental Quality Act ("CEQA") [Public Resources Code (PRC)], section 21000 et seq.] and the CEQA Guidelines [California Code of Regulations, Title 14, section 15000 et seq.] and other documentation provided by the Superintendant of the Lemoore Unified High School District (LUHSD), pursuant to my Public Records Act request.

Over the past 5-10 years, my office has been involved in the review of the General Plan updates in the cities of Bakersfield, Chico, Madera, Merced, Porterville, Visalia, Fresno, and, most recently, Hanford. Based on this experience and my legal research on the State Planning and Zoning Law [Government Code section 65300 et seq.], CEQA, the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 [Government Code section 56100 et seq., as amended], and the Subdivision Map Act [Govt. Code section 66473 et seq.], I have the following comments and objections to the administrative and environmental review of the proposed project.

I have reviewed the City General Plan, City's Municipal Code, and the project documents in the public file, including the Initial Study/Mitigated Negative Declaration ("MND") and the proposed Addendum for the proposed project. In addition, I have reviewed other public documents that are available on the City's website, along with the application for annexation, previously considered by the Lemoore Planning Commission on May 8, 2017 and the City Council on June 20, 2017. In addition, in response to comments from the Chair of the Planning Commission at the August 14 Planning Commission regarding the capacity of the Lemoore Unified High School District, I have reviewed a number of public documents from the LUHSD, including the Draft Master Facilities Plan for the District and Minutes from a number of its Board meetings.

The purpose of this letter is to update and summarize the information and comments that I have previously provided to your Council in my August 14, 2017 letter to the City Planning Commission, which is in the record before you.

- 1. Neither the Staff Report, nor the environmental review document, discloses the number of new High School students projected to enroll in the Lemoore Unified High School from the Lennar project over the next five years or at build-out.
- 2. Similarly, neither the Staff Report, nor the environmental review document, discloses the cumulative number of new High School students who are projected to enroll in the High School from all existing residential housing projects or from reasonably foreseeable projects that will be completed in the next five years.
- 3. There is no disclosure in the Mitigated Negative Declaration ("MND"), Section 3.18, a., paragraph. iii, p. 72 [June 20, 2017 Staff Report, p. 251-252] of when the proposed new High School will be constructed and opened and how many students are expected to be enrolled in the existing LUHS or what percentage over-capacity will be experienced by the High School until the new High School is completed and operating.
- 4. Likewise, there is no factual information provided upon which the preparer of the MND and City Staff base their conclusory statement that the payment of infrastructure fees will mitigate the over-capacity enrollment in the High School that will be exacerbated by the buildout of the proposed Lennar project prior to the construction and opening of the proposed new High School. Therefore, the

conclusion that the impacts from the undisclosed enrollment in the existing High School from the Lennar project will be *less than significant*.

- 5. Section 3.23, b. of the MND, entitled "Mandatory Findings of Significance" (p. 83) [June 20, 2017 Staff Report, p. 262] purports to make the finding that the cumulative impacts of the increase in the number of new students in the existing High School will not be significant because of the mitigation measure set forth in Section 3.18, a. iii. However, as noted above, there is no factual information nor data upon which this conclusory finding can be based.
- 6. There is no evidence in the record that the City of Lemoore or the Kings County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCo) has performed an updated Municipal Service Review (MSR) regarding the High School's operating at over capacity and when the completion and construction of a new High School will occur and/or what action the LUHSD intends to undertake to remedy this impact on the existing High School's resources. [See letter of August 14, 2017, citing Government Code sections 56430 and 56432 and Office of Planning and Research (OPR) Municipal Service Review Guidelines, Chapter 3, p. 9, Section A]
- 7. There is a lack of substantial credible evidence in the record upon which the City Council may rely in making its Finding 1(e) in proposed Ordinance No. 2017-07, which states:

"(e) A Mitigated Negative Declaration for the above-referenced projects was prepared in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), and was adopted at a duly noticed public meeting on August 15, 2017."

Therefore, this finding cannot be lawfully made, because such a finding would be invalid and would constitute an abuse of the Council's discretion to the prejudice of the general public of the City of Lemoore, based on the Council's failure to proceed in the manner required by law, due to the lack of substantial credible evidence to support the finding, as required by CEQA Guidelines, section 15384 [Cal. Code of Regulations, Title 15, section 15384] and Public Resources Code sections 21168 and 21168.5.

- 8. Despite the fact that the Lennar Project has been under administrative and environmental review since, at least April, 2017, the City Council has not adopted a resolution its designation of the proposed project site as a location of a "Potential High School" on the City's General Plan Land Use Map and in the text of the City General Plan. (Chapter 5, Figure 5-1, p.5-8) [Cited in Harriman letter of August 14, 2017]
- 9. The letter, dated August 26, 2016, from Debbie Muro, Superintendent of the LUHS District, to Jack Williams, which was date stamped as received by City Staff on August 26, 2017, does not constitute substantial credible evidence that the LUHSD

has taken formal action to reject the Lennar project site as a potential site for the new High School.

10. However, irrespective of whatever action the LUHSD Board has taken or not taken regarding the potential High School site proposed for development by the Applicants, the only jurisdiction with the legal power and authority to remove the existing designation from the City General Plan Land Use Map is the Lemoore City Council; and your Council has not taken such an action.

Therefore, your Council cannot make the necessary findings set forth in the proposed Resolution No. 2017-07 that states::

"(d) The above-referenced prezoning is consistent with the City of Lemoore General Plan and Lemoore Municipal Code, and would not be detrimental to the public interest, health, safety, convenience, and welfare of the City."

The reasons for this statement are:

- 1. The proposed prezoning ordinance is inconsistent with the General Plan Land Use text and map, as stated above; and
- 2. The adoption of the prezoning ordinance cannot be made due to:
 - a) the potential adverse cumulative impacts on the pre-existing over-capacity status of the LUHS;
 - b) the fact that the proposed mitigation payment by the Applicant does not and will not reduce or mitigate the existing over-crowding of the LUHS until such time as the new High School or other construction of new facilities has been completed and is in full operation;
 - c) the lack of substantial credible evidence in the record of when the new High School facilities will be completed and in full operation; and
 - d) the lack of a current MSR regarding the LUHSD facilities within the last five (5) years.

Conclusion

For the reasons stated above, based upon the research and review of the undersigned, as set forth in greater detail in my letter of August 14, 2017. my client and I respectfully submit that your City Council may not lawfully adopt the necessary findings set forth above, nor may it adopt a Resolution approving the project Applicant's application for a Vesting Tentative Subdivision Map for the project, as proposed, based on the legally inadequate Initial Study/Mitigated

Negative Declaration prepared for the Tract 920 project and relied upon for the proposed zoning ordinance No. 2017-07.

Therefore, this application must be denied and remanded to the City Staff for further action as deemed necessary in the light of the analysis stated in this letter.

Subject/Discussion:

California Government Code Section 53607 and the City of Lemoore's Investment Policy require the submission of a monthly investment report to the City Council. As of July 31, 2017, the City had \$44.75 million (current market value) in cash and investments and in the average weighted yield to maturity on the City's public fund investments was 0.59%. As required by government code, all investments are in conformity with the City's investment policy and sufficient cash flows are available to meet the next six months of estimated expenditures.

The attached Monthly Investment Report presents the investments held by the City of Lemoore as of July 31, 2017. The Investment Report consists of the following two summaries:

- <u>Summary of Cash and Investments</u> Provides the total portfolio of the City
- <u>Investments at Market Value by Maturity Date</u> Provides a list of investment by maturity date, an indication of the liquidity of the investments. The City's investment policy defines what the City can legally invest in under State Law

and City policy. These restrictions in investment types and the terms of allowable investments result in limited yields on City Investments.

As of July 31, 2017, the City had \$44,751,543 (current market value) in cash and investments. The investments included CD's (\$5.1 million), US Government Securities (\$4.99 million) and the State Investment Pool (16.1 million). The City's bank accounts held approximately \$18.53 million.

Thirty-five percent (35.99%) of the City's portfolio is with the State Investment Pool (Local Agency Investment Fund, LAIF) in which the State's Investment experts provide diversified investments in which local agencies can invest. By using the combined size of the participating cities and agencies, the State Pool can provide a better yield, liquidity and investment knowledge than otherwise would be available to a single entity.

Subject: Authorize the purchase of a 2018 Dodge Charger for the Lemoore Police Department and authorize the Interim City Manager to sign the purchase agreement

Proposed Motion:

Authorize the purchase of an additional patrol vehicle and authorize the Interim City Manager to sign the budget amendment and execute the purchase agreement.

Subject/Discussion:

City staff is requesting an additional patrol vehicle for police department operations. The City Council is asked to consider the purchase of a 2018 Dodge Charger, as well as the equipment, paint and markings necessary to put the vehicle into service for patrol operations. Staff obtained three (3) quotes for a 2018 Dodge Charger, as required by the purchasing policy, and is recommending that the City Council authorize the purchase of the vehicle from Wondries Fleet Group, at the cost of \$26,974. In addition to the purchase of the vehicle, equipment and markings for the vehicle will cost an additional \$20,880. The total cost for the purchase and outfitting of the vehicle will be \$47,854.

The Police Department currently has twenty-one (21) patrol vehicles in its inventory that are used specifically by officers whose primary duties require them to drive a patrol vehicle. As recruitment and retention continues to grow, we have twenty-one (21) full

time officers and six (6) reserve officers assigned to utilize patrol vehicles. As more and more officers are moving into and residing within the city limits, more officers are being assigned a take home patrol car.

Currently we have twelve (12) full time officers with take home patrol cars. The remaining nine (9) patrol cars are being shared amongst the fifteen (15) remaining officers. Projecting forward we anticipate hiring three (3) new reserve officers this fiscal year. We also have one new officer currently on FTO who lives in town and will be issued a patrol car when he completes his field training. This will leave eight (8) patrol cars being shared by eighteen (18) officers.

When we have a patrol vehicle sent to the city shop for maintenance or repairs, or when we have an officer(s) who is not assigned a take home car and has to go out of town for training, we do not have enough vehicles. It is not uncommon for us to have three (3) to seven (7) officers assigned to day shift, all of which are not assigned a take home vehicle. This leaves us with one (1) spare vehicle. If one (1) or more vehicle is at the shop for service or repairs, we do not have enough vehicles for every officer.

With the addition of one (1) new patrol vehicle, we would be able to ensure our fleet is up to the standards needed for patrol functions. This vehicle would be an additional patrol vehicle and we would not be replacing any current patrol vehicle.

Financial Consideration(s):

A budget adjustment to the general fund FY17/18 (4221-4840AR) in the amount of \$47,854.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

Pros:

• Ensures patrol division has the patrol vehicles needed to appropriately deploy for patrol functions.

Cons:

• The cost of this item was not budgeted in the fiscal year 2017/2018

The City of Visalia Purchasing Division is soliciting Bids for twelve (12) Dodge Chargers with upfitting for the Visalia Police Department. [Ten (10) patrol units and two (2) K-9 units].

The successful bidder shall be responsible for providing all services and products necessary to fulfill the requirements of this Invitation to Bid.

In an effort to encourage local businesses to provide goods and services to the City, Council has enacted a local preference. The local preference will apply to any business that has a business address within Tulare County for a minimum of six months. A Post Office Box will not be accepted as a business address. The City reserves the right to request proof of Tulare County address.

The local preference for bids consists of a match preference in which a local vendor whose bid is within 5% of the apparent low bidder will be given three (3) business days, from date notified, to match or beat the low bid. If there is more than one local vendor that is within the 5% range, the offer goes to the local vendor that is closest to the low bid.

IV. SCOPE OF SERVICES/PROJECT

The City of Visalia Purchasing Division is soliciting Bids for twelve (12) Dodge Chargers with upfitting for the Visalia Police Department (Ten (10) patrol units and two (2) K-9 units). Awarded Vendor will be responsible supplying twelve (12), fully-functional 2016 Dodge Chargers which meet the specifications and requirements of this RFB to the delivery points specified in this RFB.

- Awarded Vendor must deliver fully functional Dodge Chargers as specified in this RFB to the destination specified within 90 days from the City's issuance of Notice to Proceed.
- City will provide twelve (12) Motorola radios to be installed by Up-fitter.
- City will provide twelve (12) ICOP DVR units to be installed by Up-fitter.

VEHICLE SPECIFICATIONS

Vehicle specifications are described in Exhibit "D" (pages 18-24) of this RFB.

V. BID OPENING AND CONFIDENTIALITY

- 1. <u>Bid Opening.</u> Bids shall be opened publicly in the presence of attendees, if any, on October 14, 2016 at 2:00 p.m. at 707 W Acequia, Visalia CA, City Hall. The name of each Bidder and the amount of each Bid shall be open to public inspection at the Bid opening and after an award decision has been made. Other Bid information will not be available for public review during the evaluation phase or until the award of the contract.
- 2. <u>Bid Confidentiality.</u> The City favors full and open disclosure of all Bid records. The City will not expend public funds defending claims for access to, inspection of, or to be provided copies of any such records. By submitting a Bid, a Bidder agrees to indemnify and defend the City against all claims or actions brought against it to seek access to, or compel disclosure of, any records or documents in the City's possession.

After the award, the City intends that its selection process will be open and public. Respondents are advised that the California Public Records Act ("PRA") provides that any person may inspect or be provided a copy of any identifiable public record or document that is not exempted from disclosure by the express provisions of the Act. The Federal Freedom of Information Act ("FOIA") contains a similar provision. Each Bidder shall clearly identify any information within its Bid that it intends to ask the City to withhold as exempt under either the PRA or FOIA. Any information contained in a Bidder's submission which the Bidder believe qualifies for exemption from public disclosure as "Proprietary" or "Confidential" must be identified as such at the time of first submission of Bidder's Bid to this RFB. Any failure to identify information contained in a Bidder's right to object to the release of such information upon request under either Act.

VI. <u>AWARD</u>

1. <u>Most Responsive, Responsible Bidder.</u> Award shall be made to the most responsive, responsible Bidder whose Proposal meets the requirements and criteria set forth in this RFB, price and other factors considered, and whose Bid is determined to result in the optimum economic advantage to the City. A responsible Bidder is one who has the capability, financial capacity and integrity to perform the contract. A responsive Bidder is one who commits to all of the material terms, for example, price, quantity, quality and delivery, of this RFB.

The City of Visalia reserves the right to award bids received on the basis of splitting the purchases/services as described in this bid and awarding to more than one vendor and to accept the bid that is in the best interest of the City of Visalia.

2. <u>Reservation of Rights.</u> The City reserves the right to reject any item or items in the Bid; to waive informalities, technical defects, and minor irregularities in Bids received; and to select the Bid(s) deemed most advantageous to the City.

VII. PROTESTS/APPEALS

Because it is essential that Bidders have confidence in the procurement procedures for soliciting and awarding contracts, it is the policy of the City to offer Bidders the opportunity to appeal award of contracts. The following procedures shall apply in regard to appeals:

- 1. Any actual Bidder who is aggrieved in connection with this RFB or award of a contract hereunder may protest to the City of Visalia Purchasing Division in writing within five (5) working days after such aggrieved Bidder knows, should have reasonably known, or could reasonably be expected to know of the facts giving rise thereto; and
- 2. Should identify only the areas regarding bid contradictions, procurement errors, quotation rating discrepancies, legality of procurement context, conflict of interest in the rating process and inappropriate or unfair competitive procurement grievance regarding the Bid process.
- 3. The City's Purchasing Division shall have the authority to settle and resolve each protest. The resolution will be provided to Bidder in writing within five (5) working days of receipt of the appeal unless the Bidder is notified more time is required.
- 4. Further levels of appeal may be made in accordance with the appeals provision contained in Chapter 5 of the City's "Purchasing and Contract Procedures" which is available through City's Purchasing Division.

VIII. SPECIAL CONDITIONS

- 1. <u>Product Issues</u>
 - a. <u>Complete Project.</u> The successful Bidder shall be responsible for providing all materials, products, equipment and/or services necessary to fulfill the requirements of this RFB.
 - b. <u>Product Inspection</u>. The City will have ten (10) working days to inspect equipment for workmanship, appearance, proper functioning of all equipment, and conformance to all other requirements of this specification. If deficiencies are detected, the equipment will be rejected and the vendor will be required to

make necessary repairs, adjustments, or replacements. Payment and/or commencement of a discount period, if applicable, will not be made until the defects are corrected and the equipment re-inspected and accepted.

2. <u>City-Contractor Relations</u>

a. <u>Project Manager's Responsibility and Authority.</u> City will designate a Project Manager. The Project Manager shall decide issues of quality and acceptability of materials, products, equipment, and all questions related to fulfillment of the contract for the project. Project Manager shall not have control over acts or omissions of the Contractor, their agents or employees.

b. <u>Control of Materials</u>:

- (1) <u>Source of Supply and Quality of Materials Guarantee.</u> All materials, parts and equipment supplied by the Contractor shall be new and/or of a quality equal to that specified.
- (2) Equivalent Materials. Trade names or manufacturer's catalog information, where used, are a means of indicating kind, type, design, style, finish, durability or quality desired and are not intended to exclude or omit the products of any responsible manufacturer, if such products are equal in every respect to those specified. The burden of proof of compliance with the specifications is the responsibility of Contractor. City shall be the sole judge as to the adequacy of any item for substitution.
- (3) <u>Manufacturer's Directions.</u> Manufactured articles, materials and equipment shall be applied, installed, connected, erected, used, cleaned and conditioned as directed by the manufacturer.

3. Legal Responsibilities.

- a. It is the responsibility of Contractor to comply with all local, state, and federal laws and regulations which apply to this project. This includes, but is not limited to, compliance with Uniform Building, Plumbing, Mechanical, Electric, and Fire Codes. Contractor shall provide a safe working environment in compliance with the Occupational Safety and Health Act, and California Health and Safety Codes. Additionally, Contractor shall secure all necessary permits, licenses, and similar requirements to carry out the project. Contractor shall comply with all applicable labor laws, and ensure against discrimination.
- b. - 12. Any contract resulting from the RFB will be jointly administered by the City's Purchasing Division, and the Department requesting Bids.



Proposed Motion:

That City Council, after the second reading, adopt Ordinance No. 2017-07, pre-zoning the northeast corner of Hanford-Armona Road and Avenue 18¾ (Liberty Drive) to Low Density Residential (RLD), and pre-zone the site located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive (APN 023-100-007) to Very Low Density Residential (RVLD).

Subject Discussion:

Lennar Homes is proposing a 174-lot single-family subdivision with a park and storm drainage basin. The 40-acre site is located at the northeast corner of Hanford-Armona Road and Avenue 18³/₄ (Liberty Drive). In addition to the Lennar site, the proposal also includes the rural residential lot at 285 Hotchkiss Drive owned by Riley Jones. Mr. Jones' site is being provided with City water service through an outside services agreement previously approved by the Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO). A condition of LAFCO'S approval was that Mr. Jones' site be annexed in the near future. With Lennar Homes' consent, City staff is adding the Hotchkiss site to the annexation proposal to fulfill the previous commitment made by the City to LAFCO. City Council initiated annexation

proceedings on both sites on June 20, 2017, and adopted the first reading of the Ordinance to pre-zone the sites.

Financial Consideration(s):

The proposed changes will not have a financial effect on the City of Lemoore.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

There are no alternatives to the pre-zoning being recommended. Any alternatives to prezoning as recommended, would conflict with either the General Plan or State law. The alternative to initiating annexation would be to decide to not initiate proceedings.

Commission/Board Recommendation:

The Planning Commission reviewed the annexation for conformity with the General Plan, and considered the pre-zoning for the sites at their May 8, 2017, meeting. The Commission voted 6-0 (1 absence) to find that the annexation would be consistent with the General Plan, recommended that the Hanford-Armona site should be pre-zoned RLD (Low Density Residential), and recommended that the Hotchkiss site be pre-zoned RVLD (Very Low Density Residential).

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends City Council adopt Ordinance No. 2017-07 after the second reading, pre-zoning the northeast corner of Hanford-Armona Road and Avenue 18³/₄ (Liberty Drive) to Low Density Residential (RLD), and pre-zoning the site located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive (APN 023-100-007) to Very Low Density Residential (RVLD).

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-07

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE PREZONING TERRITORY LOCATED AT THE NORTHEAST CORNER OF HANFORD-ARMONA ROAD AND AVENUE 18³/₄ (LIBERTY DRIVE), AND AT 285 HOTCHKISS DRIVE

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE HEREBY DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS.

- (a) The property owner of property located at the northeast corner of Hanford-Armona Road and Avenue 18³/₄ (Liberty Drive) (APNs 021-570-001 and 021-560-001) has requested annexation into the City of Lemoore.
- (b) The City of Lemoore previously committed to the Local Agency Formation Commission to annex property located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive (APN 023-100-007), and the property owner has consented to annexation.
- (c) Government Code Section 56375(a)(7) requires that applications to the Local Agency Formation Commission for annexation include prezoning of the territory proposed for annexation.
- (d) The above-referenced prezoning is consistent with the City of Lemoore General Plan and Lemoore Municipal Code, and would not be detrimental to the public interest, health, safety, convenience, and welfare of the City.

- **<u>SECTION 4.</u>** The official Zoning Map shall be amended to reflect this change upon completion of annexation proceedings.



Proposed Motion:

Approve Resolution No. 2017-26, approving the Addendum to the Mitigated Negative Declaration, and waive the first reading of Ordinance No. 2017-11 in its entirety and set the second hearing on the Ordinance for the Council's next regular meeting, adopting Planned Unit Development No. 2017-01.

Subject Discussion:

Lennar Homes is proposing a 174-lot single-family subdivision with a park and storm drainage basin. The 40-acre site is located at the northeast corner of Hanford-Armona Road and Avenue 18³/₄ (Liberty Drive). On August 14, 2017, the Planning Commission approved a vesting tentative subdivision map and a planned unit development for the site, subject to the approval of a zoning overlay by the City Council. City Council is the final approving authority for planned unit developments, which is established through the adoption of an ordinance.

The planned unit development (PUD) in this case allows the project to deviate from the standards of the Zoning Ordinance in specific areas. It allows the developer to create lots smaller than the minimum 7,000 square feet. It allows slightly modified building setbacks. Finally, it locks in the home plans submitted by the developer, which have been shown to meet the architectural standards for single-family homes that are found in the Zoning Ordinance. The Planning Commission found that the elements within the planned unit development were appropriate for the site. Specifically, related to lot size, it is noted that the Lemoore Housing Element of the General Plan encourages greater density to reduce loss of farmland, slow urban sprawl, and reduce vehicle miles traveled. The ordinance before the City Council would affirm the Planning Commission's decision and establish the PUD on the Zoning Map.

The City Council initiated annexation proceedings on both sites on June 20, 2017, and adopted a Mitigated Negative Declaration for the project. Since that time, two issues have arisen regarding the Mitigated Negative Declaration (MND). First, a typographical error was discovered in one of the mitigation measures that provides the wrong time period in which it is allowable to remove trees. Second, the Local Agency Formation Commission of Kings County (LAFCO) has requested that the MND provide additional information regarding loss of farmland. This is further explained at the beginning section of the Addendum.

At the Planning Commission hearing, two persons spoke against the project, pointing out, among other things, that the 2008 General Plan Environmental Impact Report (EIR) states that the high school is overcrowded. However, even at the time, this was deemed by the EIR to not be a significant effect because developers are required to pay school impact fees to mitigate against impacts that new development might have on school overcrowding.

Financial Consideration(s):

The proposed changes will not have a financial effect on the City of Lemoore.

Alternatives or Pros/Cons:

There are no alternatives to adopting Addendum to the MND. The alternatives for the PUD would be to modify one or more details within in the PUD. However, such modifications may be inconsistent with approved tentative map, and would therefore require the project to be sent back to the Planning Commission for further review.

Commission/Board Recommendation:

The Planning Commission reviewed Planned Unit Development No. 2017-01, along with the associated tentative map at their August 14, 2017, meeting. The Commission voted 5-1 (Marvin against, 1 absence) to approve the project, subject to the approval of a zoning overlay by the City Council.

Staff Recommendation:

Staff recommends that City Council approve Resolution No. 2017-26, adopting the Addendum to the Mitigated Negative Declaration, and waive the first reading of Ordinance No. 2017-11, and schedule the ordinance for a second reading at the next regular council meeting, adopting Planned Unit Development No. 2017-01.

WHEREAS, the Local Agency Formation Commission of Kings County has requested that an additional statement be added to the Mitigated Negative Declaration regarding the potential for loss of farmland; and

WHEREAS, a typographical error is being corrected in Mitigation Measure 3.8.2 regarding the time period that trees can be removed; and

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Lemoore finds the following:

- 1. None of the following conditions have occurred since the adoption of the original Mitigated Negative Declaration:
 - a. Substantial changes are not proposed in the project which will require major revisions of the previous mitigated negative declaration due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the severity of previously identified significant effects;
 - b. Substantial changes have not occurred with respect to the circumstances under which the project is undertaken which will require major revisions of the mitigated negative declaration due to the involvement of new significant environmental effects or a substantial increase in the severity of previously identified significant effects;
 - c. There has been no new information of substantial importance, which was not known and could not have been known with the exercise of reasonable diligence at the time the negative declaration was adopted;

- d. The project will not have significant effects not discussed in the negative declaration;
- 2. The addendum is being prepared to add minor technical information regarding the potential for loss of farmland. The additional information does not change the

conclusion that the project would not have an impact on farmland or agricultural resources. The change in the dates of removal of trees corrects a typographical error.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-11

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE ADOPTING PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT NO. 2017-01

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. FINDINGS.

a. The property owner of property located at the northeast corner of Hanford-Armona Road and Avenue 18³/₄ (Liberty Drive) (APNs 021-570-001 and 021-560-001) has requested annexation into the City of Lemoore.

b. Government Code Section 56375(a)(7) requires applications to the Local Agency Formation Commission ("LAFCO") for annexation to include prezoning of the territory proposed for annexation. The subject property has been prezoned Low Density Residential ("RLD") in anticipation of annexation.

c. The RLD zone has a minimum lot size of 7,000 square feet. The applicant has proposed modifications to the development standards, which can be obtained through the approval of a Planned Unit Development ("PUD").

d. On August 14, 2017, the Planning Commission for the City of Lemoore approved the PUD project, including specific building setback and architectural requirements, subject to approval by the City Council of a zoning overlay for the PUD.

e. The proposed PUD would modify the development standards for the RLD to allow smaller sized lots. The smallest lot would be 5,265 square feet, with the average size being 6,296 square feet. The minimum lot width is 55 feet, and minimum lot depth is 100 feet. The PUD is proposed to be developed in two phases.

f. The building setbacks for the proposed PUD shall be as follows: front yard – 18 to 22 feet; side yard - 5 feet; street side yard - 10 feet; rear yard - 10 feet. The front yard setback of adjacent homes shall have a minimum 2-foot stagger between adjacent lots.

g. The PUD has four floor plans with square footages of 1,847, 2,170, 2,200, and 2,245 square feet. All of the home plans are single-story homes. All homes will have tile roofs.

h. All of the elevations for the homes in the PUD conform to the City's design standards. All homes in the PUD would have façade materials along the side yard elevations to the fence line. For homes in the PUD placed on corner lots, the stone/brick veneer placed on the front of the homes would be wrapped around the street side of the home up to the fence. Also, stucco/foam window treatments used on the front of the

home would also be used on the street side of the home where windows are visible from the street.

i. All homes in the PUD would be oriented to the street, with garages deemphasized and living areas placed toward the front of homes.

j. The proposed PUD would have two access points on Liberty Drive. As such, all vehicle trips would move through the intersection of Hanford-Armona Road and Liberty Drive. However, the increase in trips through this intersection does not warrant the installation of a traffic signal.

k. Plans for all public and private improvements in the PUD, including but not limited to, water, sewer, storm drainage, road pavement, curb and gutter, sidewalk, street lights, landscaping, and fire hydrants are required to be approved by the City Engineer, and these improvements shall be completed in accordance with the approved plans to the satisfaction of the Public Works Department.

1. Park land in-lieu fees for the PUD would be paid to the City, prior to the approval of the final map, for 2.78 acres minus the acres provides for the park on the final map. The park would be constructed and opened to the public for use prior to the final inspection of the 5th new home constructed in Phase 2.

m. A public facilities maintenance district for the PUD would be formed in conjunction with the final map acceptance in order to provide the maintenance costs for the park, storm drain basin, common landscaping, and other improvements, in accordance with existing City policy.

n. A 6-foot to 7-foot block wall would be constructed adjacent Liberty Drive, Hanford-Armona Road, and the east side of the subdivision.

o. Fire hydrant types and locations for the PUD would be approved by the Lemoore Volunteer Fire Department.

p. Street trees for the PUD would be from the City's approved list, and would be planted with root barriers as per Public Works' Standards and Specifications.

q. Street lights shall be provided within the project as per City local street lighting standards.

r. All sidewalks for the PUD would be of "Parkway Type" as per City standard.

s. This ordinance is consistent with the City of Lemoore General Plan, Lemoore Municipal Code and the Zoning Ordinance and would not be detrimental to the public interest, health, safety, convenience, and welfare of the City. t. A Mitigated Negative Declaration for the project has been prepared and adopted in accordance with the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA).

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT OF CODE: ADOPTION OF PLANNED UNIT DEVELOPMENT OVERLAY ZONES

Article "B" of Chapter 9 of Title 9 of the Lemoore Municipal Code is amended as follows:

Table 9-9B-3-1, containing the adopted PUD overlay zones, is hereby amended to add the following zone:

Number: 2017-01 Name: Lennar Homes, Tract 920 Phases I & II. Date Approved: September 19, 2017 Resolution Number: 2017-05 Average Density Per Gross Acre (du/ac): 4.35

Table 9-9B-4-1, containing specific development standards the adopted PUD overlay zones, is hereby amended to add the following zone:

Number: 2017-01 Name: Lennar Homes, Tract 920 Phases I & II. Front Setback: 18-22 feet Side Setback: 5 and 10 feet Rear Setback: 10 feet

SECTION 3. SEVERABILITY.

If any provision of this ordinance is declared unlawful by a court of competent jurisdiction, the City Council intends that the remaining provisions of this ordinance remain in effect.

SECTION 4. EFFECTIVE DATE.

The ordinance codified herein shall take effect and be in full force and effect from and after thirty (30) days after its final passage and adoption. Within fifteen (15) days after its adoption, the ordinance codified herein, or a summary of the ordinance codified herein, shall be published once in a newspaper of general circulation.

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ADDENDUM TO MITIGATED NEGATIVE DECLARATION

As Lead Agency under the California Environmental Quality Act (CEQA), the City of Lemoore reviewed the Project described below to determine whether it could have a significant effect on the environment because of its development. In accordance with CEQA Guidelines § 15382, "[s]ignificant effect on the environment" means a substantial, or potentially substantial, adverse change in any of the physical conditions within the area affected by the project, including land, air, water, minerals, flora, fauna, ambient noise, and objects of historic or aesthetic significance. A Mitigated Negative Declaration was prepared, and was then adopted by the Lemoore City Council on June 20, 2017. This document is an Addendum to that Mitigated Negative Declaration, and has been prepared in accordance with CEQA Guidelines §15162 and §15164.

The Addendum has been prepared for two purposes. The first is to correct a typographical error in Mitigation Measure 3.8.2. The second is to provide additional information requested by the Local Agency Formation Commission of Kings County regarding the potential loss of farmland.

Project Name

Lennar Homes Tract 920 and Riley Jones Property

Project Location

The subdivision site is located at the northeast corner of Hanford-Armona Road and Avenue 18 ³/₄ (Liberty Drive) (APNs 021-570-001 and 021-560-001). The additional rural residential site is located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive (APN 023-100-007).

Project Description

A request by Lennar Homes for annexation of 40 acres into the City of Lemoore and for approval of a tentative subdivision map of 174 single-family lots and a 2.14-acre park/basin. The annexation also includes a non-contiguous developed rural residential lot.

Purpose of Addendum

When a proposed project is changed or there are changes in environmental setting, a determination must be made by the lead agency as to whether an Addendum or Subsequent EIR or MND is prepared. CEQA Guidelines §15162 and §15164 sets forth criteria to assess which environmental document is appropriate. The criteria for determining whether an Addendum or Subsequent MND is prepared are outlined below. If the criteria below are true, then an Addendum is the appropriate document:

- No new significant impacts will result from the project or from new mitigation measures.
- No substantial increase in the severity of environmental impact will occur.
- No new feasible alternatives or mitigation measures that would reduce impacts previously found not to be feasible have, in fact, been found to be feasible.

Based upon provided information in this document, the changes to the Approved Project will not result in any new significant impacts or substantially increase the severity of impacts previously identified in the IS/MND, and there are no previously infeasible alternatives that are now feasible. None of the other factors set forth in §15162(a)(3) are present. Therefore, an Addendum is appropriate, and this Addendum has been prepared to address the environmental effects of the refinements to the project.

SECTION 1 - PROJECT DESCRIPTION

Introduction

The Project is the annexation, construction and operation of a tentative subdivision map of 174 single-family lots and a 2.14-acre park/basin (Project). The annexation also includes a non-contiguous developed rural residential lot.

Project Location

The subdivision site consists of two-contiguous parcels (APN 021-560-001 and 021-570-001) located at the northeast corner of the Hanford Armona Road and 18 ³/₄ Avenue (Liberty Drive) inter§ in north-central Lemoore. Both parcels are located entirely within Kings County with the entire east, south and half of the west parcel lines adjacent to the existing City limits. The site is in Section 34, Township 18 South, Range 20 East, Mount Diablo Base and Meridian (MDB&M) within the Lemoore United States Geological Survey (USGS) 7.5-minute topographic quadrangle.

The non-contiguous developed rural residential lot is located at 285 Hotchkiss Drive in southeast Lemoore (APN 023-100-007). The property is also located entirely within Kings County with the north parcel line adjacent to City limits. The site is in Section 11, Township 19 South, Range 20 East, MDB&M within the Lemoore USGS 7.5-minute topographic quadrangle.

Both sites are located within the General Plan Urban Growth Boundary. Figure 1-3 and Figure 1-4 provide a regional vicinity and location map of the Project site, respectively.

Surrounding Land Uses

The area surrounding the proposed subdivision site consists of a small orchard to the north, disked-undeveloped agricultural land to the west, a mobile home park to the east and single-family residential development to the south and southwest. Land uses and development surrounding the subdivision site are depicted on Figure 1-5.

The area surrounding the residential lot solely includes similar rural residential development. Beyond the residences to the east is an open space area with dense tree coverage. Land uses and development surrounding the residential lot are depicted on Figure 1-6 and Figure 1-5.

Proposed Project


The proposed Project is the development of 174 single-family lots and a 2.14-acre park/basin on two contiguous parcels totaling 40 acres (Figure 1-1). The lot size will range from approximately 5,200 sq.ft. to approximately 13,000 sq.ft. The City actions required to permit the Project include an annexation with prezoning consistent with the General Plan, minor site plan review, and a vesting tentative subdivision map. Currently, the site, is undeveloped apart from several trees and a single-family residence. The


site's General Plan land use designation is Low Density Single-family Residential and is zoned Low Density Residential (RLD).

The annexation request also includes a non-contiguous developed rural residential lot (Figure 1-2). On August 26, 2015, LAFCo approved an extension of service to allow the City to provide water service to the identified property. LAFCo's approval included a condition that the City submit an application to LAFCo initiating annexation of the site when feasible. The City will be submitting an annexation request to LAFCo that includes both the Lennar Homes Tract 920 project and the residential property. The rural residential lot will create zero impacts identified in the Initial Study Checklist as the use of the property will remain completely unchanged and no new development is being proposed. The site is considered as having no impact. The site's General Plan Land use designation is Very Low Density Residential and is zoned Very Low Density Residential (RVLD).


Conclusion





SECTION 2 - MODIFICATION TO MITIGATION MEASURE 3.8.2

After the Mitigated Negative Declaration was adopted, a typographical error was discovered in Mitigation Measure 3.8.2. This mitigation measure reads:

MM 3.8.2: A qualified biologist shall be obtained to assist in the removal of the on-site trees. The removal of trees shall be done between February 15th to August 15th to avoid potential impacts with nesting birds.

In actuality, the allowable period for removal of trees to avoid nesting periods is August 15th to February 15th. Therefore, the mitigation measure is hereby changed to read:

MM 3.8.2: A qualified biologist shall be obtained to assist in the removal of the on-site trees. The removal of trees shall be done between August 15th and February 15th to avoid potential impacts with nesting birds.

This change does not affect the conclusions of the mitigated negative declaration.

SECTION 3 - ADDITIONAL INFORMATION REGARDING AGRICULTURE RESOURCES

The proposed annexation for the non-contiguous rural residential lot would have no impact to agriculture and forestry resources as no new development would occur as a result of the annexation. The responses below are in regards to the proposed subdivision development.

Response: a), b), c), d), e) There will not be any conversion of farmland, nor conflict with any existing zoning for agricultural use or forest land, or Williamson Act contracts. The proposed Project site is classified as "vacant or disturbed land" and "rural residential land" by the Department of Conservation's Farmland Mapping and Monitoring Program (FMMP). The site is an undeveloped-vacant urban parcel.

Mitigation Measures: None are required.

Conclusion: There would be *no impact.*

The Local Agency Formation Commission of Kings County (LAFCO) has requested additional information in the environmental document to address the impacts and potential mitigation to the loss of prime farmland. While the Mitigated Negative Declaration correctly states that the Project site is classified as "vacant or disturbed land" and "rural residential land" by the Department of Conservation's Farmland Mapping and Monitoring Program (FMMP), LAFCO evaluates the potential loss of farmland due to annexation using the definition of prime agricultural land found in Government Code § 56064.

Government Code 56064

According to Government Code §56064, "prime agricultural land" means an area of land, whether a single parcel or contiguous parcels, that has not been developed for a use other than agricultural use and that meets any of the following qualifications:

- (a) Land that qualifies, if irrigated, for rating as class I or class II in the USDA Natural Resources Conservation Service land use capability classification, whether or not land is actually irrigated, provided that irrigation is feasible.
- (b) Land that qualifies for rating 80 through 100 Storie Index Rating.
- (c) Land that supports livestock used for the production of food and fiber and that has an annual carrying capacity equivalent to at least one animal unit per acre as defined by the United States Department of Agriculture in the National Range and Pasture Handbook, Revision 1, December 2003.

- (d) Land planted with fruit or nut-bearing trees, vines, bushes, or crops that have a nonbearing period of less than five years and that will return during the commercial bearing period on an annual basis from the production of unprocessed agricultural plant production not less than four hundred dollars (\$400) per acre.
- (e) Land that has returned from the production of unprocessed agricultural plant products an annual gross value of not less than four hundred dollars (\$400) per acre for three of the previous five calendar years.

The Project site has not been used for agricultural purposes during the last six FMMP surveys, dating back to 2006. However, agricultural use before that time may have occurred. A rural residence has been built on approximately five acres of the site. This is the area that is identified as rural residential land by the FMMP. Therefore, up to 35 acres could qualify as prime agricultural land is it meets one of the five criteria in §56064.

The site does not support livestock used for production of food or fiber. If is not planted in fruit or nut-bearing trees, vines, bushes, or crops. The land also has not returned over \$400 per acres in any of the last five calendar years. Therefore, the land does not qualify as prime farmland under criteria c, d, or e.

As shown in Figure 3 -, the site contains Grangeville sandy loam soil. This soil type is very deep, somewhat poorly drained, moderately permeable soil. It has a Storie Index of 51. It has Class II rating if irrigated, and a Class VI rating is not irrigated.

The Project site is surrounded on three sides by urban development, making it difficult to determine if the site could feasibly be irrigated. The startup costs of drilling a new well that would only serve 35 acres or of obtaining surface water rights and constructing a pipeline to the site may be enough to question whether irrigation is feasible. If irrigation is feasible, then 35 acres out of the 40 acres would be considered prime agricultural land under §56064 based on its class II soil rating.


Government Code 56668 and 56016

Government Code §56668 also requires LAFCO to effect of the proposal on maintaining the physical and economic integrity of agricultural lands, as defined by §56016. This section defines "agricultural land" as land currently used for the purpose of producing an agricultural commodity for commercial purposes, land left fallow under a crop rotational program, or land enrolled in an agricultural subsidy or set-aside program. By this definition, the Project area does not qualify as agricultural land because it does not meet any of the three listed criteria.

Lemoore General Plan and General Plan EIR

The site is surrounded on three sides by urban development. The area was planned for Low Density Residential uses in the 2008 Lemoore General Plan, as were additional properties to the north of the site. The site is within the planned growth pattern of the city and is within the Primary Sphere of Influence of the City. The site is not under a Williamson Act contract.

The Lemoore General Plan EIR addressed the loss of agricultural land due to planned urban growth, and a statement of overriding considerations was adopted. The project area was included in that review. No new environmental impacts or increases in the planned rate of loss of agricultural land are anticipated.



As stated above, the site is surrounded on three sides by urban development. The area was planned for urban development by both the Lemoore General Plan and the Primary Sphere of Influence. Therefore, this additional information provided does not affect the original conclusions of the Mitigated Negative Declaration.

Approve the introduction and first reading of Ordinance 2017-12, an Ordinance amending Title 3, Chapter 2 of the City of Lemoore Municipal Code establishing the Downtown Merchant's Advisory Committee for the City of Lemoore, waive the reading of the Ordinance in its entirety and set the second reading for September 19, 2017.

Subject/Discussion:

In 1975, the Lemoore City Council, by ordinance, established a Downtown Business Improvement Area. In 1976, the City Council imposed a Business Improvement Area Assessment upon all permanent businesses located within the boundaries of the Downtown Business Improvement Area. The assessment is equal to 100% of the of the business license fees which are paid annually. The assessment collected on behalf of the businesses within the downtown area are for the following purposes:

- 1. The acquisition, construction, installation or maintenance of parking facilities, benches, trash receptacles, street lighting, decorations, parks and fountains for the benefit of the area.
- 2. Decoration of any public place in the area.

- 3. Promotion of public events which are to take place on or in public places in the area.
- 4. Furnishing of music in any public place in the area.
- 5. The general promotion of activities which benefit business located in the area.
- 6. Promotion of tourism within the area.

As a means to help determine the best use of the funds collected for the downtown area, City Council established the Downtown Merchants Advisory Committee. The committee is for the sole purpose of advising the council and making recommendations on the operations and extent of the area, and the methods and ways in which the revenue derived from the assessment may be used.

The current ordinance defining the Downtown Merchants Advisory Committee, states that the committee shall consist of nine (9) members, with applications to be approved by the City Council by majority vote for a term of two (2) calendar years having alternating expiration dates. However, it is the recommendation of staff that the membership of the committee be reduced to five (5), due to decreased interest and participation from downtown area business owners and employees, the committee has struggled to hold regular public meetings.

The revisions to the ordinance would reduce the membership from nine (9) to five (5), as well as increase the potential membership, by allowing any business owner within city limits to participate. Preference would be given to downtown area business owners, and employees, however if ample committee members cannot be selected from downtown area applicants, all business owners and employees within Lemoore city limits would be eligible to apply in order to ensure the committee remains viable.

If the City is unable to hold regular public meetings of the Downtown Merchants Advisory Committee, the City is responsible for ensuring that all funds collected as part of the Downtown Business Improvement Area are utilized for the specific purposes as outlined in the ordinance. In fiscal year 2016-2017, the Downtown Business Improvement Area collected \$9,024.

Pros:

- Maintains the viability of the Downtown Merchants Advisory Committee
- Increases the ability of the group to hold regular public meetings

Cons:

• Perception may be that reduction in Committee members will reduce public input.

The Downtown Merchant's Advisory Committee has been unable to meet due to a lack of a quorum and therefore is unable to make an official recommendation.

Staff Recommendation:

It is recommended that the Council introduce and hold its first hearing on the proposed Ordinance, waive the reading of the Ordinance in its entirety and set its second hearing for the next regular Council meeting. If the Ordinance is adopted at that subsequent meeting, then the changes would take effect in 30 days following that adoption.

ORDINANCE NO. 2017-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LEMOORE AMENDING TITLE 3, CHAPTER 2, SECTION 5 OF THE LEMOORE MUNICIPAL CODE

The City Council of the City of Lemoore does ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 5 of Chapter 2 of Title 3 of the Municipal Code is hereby amended to read as follows:

3-2-5 DOWNTOWN MERCHANTS ADVISORY COMMITTEE:

For the sole purpose of advising the council and making recommendations on the operation and extent of the area, the methods and ways in which the revenue derived from the assessment imposed by this chapter shall be used within the scope of the purposes set forth in this chapter, and to have and to perform such other powers and duties as the council may determine, there shall be created an advisory committee, which shall consist of nine (9) five (5) members with applications to be approved by city council by a majority vote for a term of two (2) calendar years having alternating expiration dates. The terms of office shall expire at eleven fifty nine o'clock (11:59) P.M. on December 31 of the last year of each member's term of office. Members shall be persons who own or are employed in businesses within the downtown area, or persons who own or are employed in any business within city limits, should vacancies still exist after processing and selecting members from the downtown area. Members of the advisory committee shall serve at the pleasure of the mayor and city council, and may be removed by the: a) expiration of term, or b) majority vote of the city council. Should no appointments be made by the expiration of term, the member will remain in office until an appointment is made.

The nine (9) members shall be appointed for two (2) year staggered terms, as follows: in the year 2016, four (4) members shall be appointed and shall serve for one year; five (5) members shall serve for two (2) years. At the expiration of the said terms, the terms of all appointed members of the committee shall be two (2) years. (Ord. 2016-02, 1-19-2016)

SECTION 2. Severance Clause.

The City Council declares that each provision of this ordinance is severable and independent of every other provision. If any portion of this ordinance is held invalid, the City Council declares that it would have adopted the remaining provisions of this ordinance irrespective of the portion held in valid, and further declares its express intent that the remaining provisions of this ordinance should remain in effect after the invalid portion has been eliminated.

<u>SECTION 3</u>. This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its adoption.

SECTION 4. The City Clerk is hereby directed to cause a summary of this Ordinance to be published by one insertion in a newspaper of general circulation in the community at least five (5) days prior to adoption and again (15) days after its adoption. If a summary of the ordinance is published, then the City Clerk shall cause a certified copy of the full text of the proposed ordinance
